5	SECT	<b>TON 1.</b> S.L. 2011-259 reads as rewritten:			
6	"SECTION	1. The State Board of Education shall implement a three-year Dropout			
7		ecovery Pilot Program in New Hanover County Schools and three other local			
8		tive units selected by the State Board of Education. The State Board shall also			
9		r schools approved by the State Board under G.S.115C-238.29D, at least one			
10		be located in Mecklenburg County, to establish Dropout Prevention and			
11		ograms. The purpose of the pilot program is to reengage students and increase			
12		tes in North Carolina through an educational program that provides flexible			
13	scheduling and a blended learning environment with individualized and self-paced learning				
14	options.				
15		2. Under the pilot program, the educational services and programming shall be			
16	provided by an education partner that is a nonprofit or for-profit entity approved by the State				
17		ion. The local school administrative unitunits and charter schools shall be			
18	1	porting enrollment to the Department of Public Instruction, working with the			
19		to align graduation requirements, and issuing diplomas to those students in			
20		complete the necessary graduation requirements. The participating schools			
21		ed by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools as an indicator of

23		B. The pilot program shall provide <u>at least</u> the following:			
24	(1)	Facilities that are easily accessible to the students being served.			
25	(2)	Flexible scheduling, including at least two different program schedules.			
26	(3)	Differentiated instruction that shall include individualized, group, and online			
27		instructional components.			
28	(4)	The capacity for assessing, recording, and responding to the students'			
29		academic progress on a daily basis using assessments that are aligned with			
30		State and local standards and requirements.			
31	<u>(5)</u>	A focus on serving a defined population of at-risk students who have			
32		dropped out or are likely to drop out of school in the foreseeable future			
33		without some type of intervention.			
34	<u>(6)</u>	Support services, including social workers and crisis intervention			
35		professionals who are trained to assist students in removing barriers to			
36		attending school and graduating.			



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## **General Assembly of North Carolina** Session 2013 1 "SECTION 5A. Data to inform student performance evaluation shall be gathered and 2 analyzed by the pilot program provider according to State Board of Education policies on the 3 accountability model provided for alternative learning programs. This data shall be used by the 4 State Board of Education to (i) report on the success of the pilot program to the Joint 5 Legislative Education Oversight Committee and (ii) make continuation funding decisions about 6 the pilot program. 7 **"SECTION 6.** A student attending the pilot program shall be enrolled as a student of the 8 resident local school administrative unit or charter school. The student shall be included in the 9 ADM of that unit or charter school. The resident local school administrative unit or charter 10 schools shall retain five percent (5%) of the total per pupil funding for the student to cover 11 administrative costs and shall remit payment to the education partner of the remaining 12 ninety-five percent (95%) within 15 days of receiving payment from the Department of Public 13 Instruction. 14 The State Board shall provide from funds available in the ADM Contingency Reserve an additional per pupil funding allotment to local school administrative units to transfer schools 15 16 participating in the pilot program, or to charter schools participating in the program that 17 demonstrate that the average daily membership is at least thirty percent (30%) higher than the 18 average daily membership of the first month of the school year. The additional allotment shall 19 be made on a nondiscretionary basis and shall be based on December average daily 20 membership. 21 If the State Board does not have sufficient resources in the ADM Contingency Reserve line 22 item to make all allotment adjustments in accordance with this section, the State Board of 23 Education may use funds appropriated to the State Aid for Public Schools for this purpose. 24 "SECTION 7. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the State Board of Education 25 shall authorize participating local school administrative units and charter schools to implement 26 flexible attendance requirements for students participating in the pilot program due to the 27 flexible scheduling and online portions of the pilot program. 28 "SECTION 8. The pilot program shall be operated through the State Board of 29 Education Education, a charter school authorized by the State Board, or as a program of the 30 contracting local school administrative unit. The pilot program may be an alternative 31 school.school within the local school administrative unit. 32 "SECTION 9. This act becomes effective July 1, 2011. July 1, 2013." 33 **SECTION 2.** The State Board of Education shall report to the Joint Legislative 34 Education Oversight Committee on the implementation and success of the pilot programs on or 35 before March 15, 2014. 36 SECTION 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the State Board of 37 Education the sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) in recurring funds to provide additional 38 funds for the ADM Contingency Reserve. 39 **SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to schools 40 selected by the State Board of Education on or after July 1, 2013.
