2	AN ACT TO REDUCE REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS.		
3	Whereas, the General Assembly recognizes that local school administrative units		
4	have become overburdened with paperwork; and		
5	Whereas, local school administrative units are also overburdened with reporting		
6	requirements by the Department of Public Instruction and other various State and federal		
7	agencies; and		
8	Whereas, in some cases much of this paperwork is duplicative and nonessential to		
9	educational outcomes for our students; and		
10	Whereas, the General Assembly desires to remedy this with input from those closest		
11	to the issues; and		
12	Whereas, school superintendents from across North Carolina were asked to work		
13	together in regional groups to review 153 current rules and regulations with which they must		
14	comply; and		
15	Whereas, the school superintendents working group(s) have reported back		
16	recommendations on whether to keep, revise, study, or delete any of these 153 current rules and		
17	regulations; and		
18	Whereas, the useful information and data that may have been supplied in these		
19	reports will continue to be available through the PowerSchool application coming online in		
20	2013; and		
21	Whereas, a reduction in reporting and/or paperwork will not result in a lack of		
22	informed decision making but will allow local school administrative units to operate more		
23	efficiently; Now, therefore,		
24	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
25	<b>SECTION 1.(a)</b> The Department of Public Instruction shall simplify and minimize		
26	data entry requirements of local school administrative units to achieve the least burdensome		
27	administrative data entry workload possible, particularly as it relates to the implementation of		
28	the PowerSchool application and any other component of the Instructional Improvement		
29	System.		
30	SECTION 1.(b) The Department of Public Instruction shall comply with		
31	G.S. 115C-12(19)(i) and not require as a separate submission at least all of the following		
32	reports to reduce unnecessary reporting requirements for local school administrative units:		
33	(1) The Principal's Monthly Report (PMR) Final, required by the 30th of each		
34	month.		
35	(2) The Teacher Vacancy Report, required by October 20th each year.		
36	(3) The Professional Personnel Activity Report (PPAR), required annually.

	<b>SECTION 3.(a)</b> G.S. 115C-12(19) reads as rewritten:
	"§ 115C-12. Powers and duties of the Board generally.
	(19) Duty to Identify Required Reports and to Eliminate Unnecessary Reports and Paperwork. – Prior to the beginning of each school year, the State Board of Education shall identify all reports that are required at the State level for the school year.
	The State Board of Education shall adopt policies to ensure that local
	school administrative units are not required by the State Board of Education,
	the State Superintendent, or the Department of Public Instruction staff to (i)
	provide information that is already available on the student information
	management system or housed within the Department of Public Instruction;
	(ii) provide the same written information more than once during a school
	year unless the information has changed during the ensuing period;-or (iii)
	complete forms, for children with disabilities, that are not necessary to
	ensure compliance with the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education
	Act (IDEA): (IDEA); or (iv) provide information that is unnecessary to
	comply with State or federal law and not relevant to student outcomes and
	the efficient operation of the public schools. Notwithstanding the foregoing,
	the State Board may require information available on its student information
	management system or require the same information twice if the State Board
	can demonstrate a compelling need and can demonstrate there is not a more
	expeditious manner of getting the information. The State Board shall permit schools and local school administrative
	units to submit all reports to the Department of Public Instruction
	electronically.
	The State Board of Education, in collaboration with the education
	roundtables within the Department of Public Instruction, shall consolidate all
	plans that affect the school community, including school improvement plans.
	The consolidated plan shall be posted on each school's Web site for easy
	access by the public and by school personnel.
	The State Board shall report to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight
	Committee by November 15 of each year on the reports identified that are
	required at the State level, the evaluation and determination for continuing
	individual reports, including the consideration of whether those reports
	exceed what is required by State and federal law, and any reports that it has
	consolidated or eliminated for the upcoming school year.

	<b>SECTION 3.(b)</b> Notwithstanding the requirements of G.S. 115C-12(19), as
	enacted by this act, the State Board of Education shall report to the Joint Legislative Education
	Oversight Committee no later than March 15, 2014, on (i) the elimination of reporting
	requirements and (ii) reduction or changes in the data entry workload for local school administrative units as a neult of the implementation of the DeverSchool application or any
	administrative units as a result of the implementation of the PowerSchool application or any other component of the Instructional Improvement System. The State Board of Education shall
	other component of the Instructional Improvement System. The State Board of Education shall also include in its report the availability of accurate data and information for decision making
	and the justification for the continuation of any reports required to be submitted by local school
	administrative units.

## **General Assembly Of North Carolina**

1 **SECTION 4.** Sections 1 and 2 of this act are effective upon the implementation of 2 the PowerSchool application or any other component of the Instructional Improvement System 3 by the Department of Public Instruction. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes

4 law and applies beginning with the 2013-2014 school year.
