A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT A PERSON WHO ALERTS AN OFFICER OF THE 3 PRESENCE OF A HYPODERMIC NEEDLE OR OTHER SHARP OBJECT POSSESSED 4 BY THE PERSON PRIOR TO A SEARCH BY THE OFFICER SHALL NOT BE 5 CHARGED WITH POSSESSION OF DRUG PARAPHERNALIA FOR POSSESSION OF 6 THE NEEDLE OR OTHER SHARP OBJECT. 7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 8 SECTION 1. G.S. 90-113.22 is amended by adding a new subsection to read: 9 Prior to searching a person, a person's premises, or a person's vehicle, an officer "(c) 10 may ask the person whether the person is in possession of a hypodermic needle or other sharp 11 object that may cut or puncture the officer or whether such a hypodermic needle or other sharp 12 object is on the premises or in the vehicle to be searched. If there is a hypodermic needle or other sharp object on the person, on the person's premises, or in the person's vehicle and the 13 person alerts the officer of that fact prior to the search, the person shall not be charged with or 14 prosecuted for possession of drug paraphernalia for the needle or sharp object. The exemption 15 under this subsection does not apply to any other drug paraphernalia that may be present and 16 found during the search. For purposes of this subsection, the term "officer" includes "criminal 17 justice officers" as defined in G.S. 17C-2(3) and a "justice officer" as defined in 18 19 G.S. 17E-2(3)." 20 SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2013, and applies to 21 offenses committed on or after that date.
