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"CREATION OF STATE EMPLOYEE JOB RELOCATION TASK FORCE

SECTION 30.2B. Chapter 126 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new article to read:

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"Article 17.

"State Employee Job Relocation Task Force.

24 '§ 126-105. Task force – creation; membership; terms; vacancies.

- (a) Creation. There is created the North Carolina State Employee Job Relocation Task Force within the Office of State Personnel for budgetary purposes only.
- (b) Membership. The Task Force shall be composed of 9 members, 3 of whom shall be appointed by the State Personnel Director, 3 of whom shall be appointed by the Secretary of the Department of Commerce, and 3 of whom shall be appointed by the Director of the Division of Employment Security of the Department of Commerce.
- (c) Terms; Filling of Vacancies. All members of the Task Force are voting members. Vacancies in the appointed membership shall be filled by the appointing officer who made the



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initial appointment. Terms shall be two years. The members shall elect a chair who shall
preside for the duration of the chair's term as member. In the event a vacancy occurs in the
chair before the expiration of the chair's term, the members shall elect an acting chair to serve
for the remainder of the unexpired term.

(d) Duties. – The Task Force Shall:

- (1) Continually work with other State agencies and local governments to identify vacant State positions and the skills and experience that those positions require.
- (2) Upon receipt of a notification pursuant to G.S. 126-106, conduct an assessment of the skills and experience of State employees whose positions are potentially subject to elimination. Assessments pursuant to this subdivision may be done remotely, on site, or in any manner that the Task Force deems appropriate and efficient.
- (3) Upon receipt of a notification pursuant to G.S. 126-107, facilitate the application by employees who are in positions that are being eliminated, for vacant positions elsewhere in State or local government.

'§ 126-106. Notification to Task Force of significant potential job relocation needs.

- (a) Notification by OSBM. The Office of State Budget and Management shall continuously survey the bills that are introduced in the General Assembly. In the event that a bill, or combination of bills, passes either chamber of the General Assembly that if enacted might result in the elimination of at least 100 or more State employee positions in a Tier 1 or Tier 2 county, the Office of State Budget and Management shall notify the State Employee Job Relocation Task Force of the potential position losses.
- (b) Notification by the Governor. Irrespective of what bills have been introduced in the General Assembly, the Governor may notify the State Employee Job Relocation Task Force of potential position losses that might result from actions he might propose. A notification made pursuant to this subsection and any records associated with it shall be confidential and shall not be a public record under Chapter 132 of the General Statutes.

'§ 126-107. Notification to Task Force of significant position eliminations.

The Office of State Budget and Management shall continuously survey the bills that become law and shall notify the State Employee Job Relocation Task Force in the event that any bill, or combination of bills, becomes law that will result in the elimination of 100 or more State employee positions in a Tier 1 or Tier 2 county.

'§ 126-108. State agencies must cooperate with Task Force.

State agencies shall cooperate with the State Employee Job Relocation Task Force in its efforts to identify vacant positions, to identify the skills and experience needed for those positions, and to facilitate the application of State employees whose positions are being eliminated for those positions.

'§ 126-109. Applicable law applies to Task Force activities.

All activities of the State Employee Job Relocation Task Force and State and local agencies pursuant to this Article shall be subject to applicable personnel laws."; and
