1 2	A SENATE RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE PERMANENT RULES OF THE SENATE CONCERNING CONFIRMATION OF GUBERNATORIAL APPOINTMENTS,
3	REFERRAL OF RESOLUTIONS, AND STANDING COMMITTEES.
4	Be it resolved by the Senate:
5	SECTION 1. Senate Rule 40.1(b), as contained in Senate Resolution 1, 2013
6	Regular Session of the General Assembly, reads as rewritten:
7	"(b) All public bills and resolutions, except those providing for action on gubernatorial
8	nominations or appointments or adjourning the General Assembly, must be filed for
9	introduction not later than Friday, March 15, 2013, provided that any such measure submitted
10	to the Bill Drafting Division of the Legislative Services Office by 4:00 P.M. on that day and
11	filed for introduction in the Senate before 3:00 P.M. on Thursday, March 28, 2013, shall be
12	treated as if it had been filed for introduction under this rule."
13	SECTION 2. The permanent rules of the Senate as contained in Senate Resolution
14	1, 2013 Regular Session of the General Assembly, are amended by adding a new rule to read:
15	"RULE 49. Consideration of Gubernatorial Nominations or Appointments When
16	received by the Principal Clerk, written notice of a gubernatorial nomination or appointment
17	that requires confirmation by the General Assembly or the Senate shall be read in session and
18	shall be referred by the Chairman of the Committee on Rules and Operations of the Senate, or
19	in his absence the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, to the appropriate Senate committee.
20	The Chairman of the Committee on Rules and Operations of the Senate may file an appropriate
21	resolution for consideration of the nomination or appointment. For statewide or at-large
22	nominations or appointments, the Principal Clerk shall transmit a copy of the notice of
23	nomination or appointment to the Senator or Senators representing the county in which the
24	nominee or appointee resides. For nominations or appointments of persons to represent a
25	particular district or region of the State, the Principal Clerk shall transmit a copy of the notice
26	of nomination or appointment to the Senator or Senators representing all or a portion of the
27	particular district or region to be represented. The chair of the Senate committee receiving
28	referral of any nomination or appointment shall determine the procedure by which the
29	committee shall consider that nomination or appointment and may make a report of its
30	recommendation to the Senate."
31	<b>SECTION 3.</b> Senate Rule 40(b1), as contained in Senate Resolution 1, 2013
32	Regular Session of the General Assembly, reads as rewritten:
33	"(b1) Simple resolutions conforming to subsection (b) of this section and any Senate or
34	House joint resolutions shall be read for the first time during the Senate's next daily session
35	occurring on a Tuesday. in their regular order. Upon such first reading such resolution the
36	Chairman of the Committee on Rules and Operations of the Senate may either refer the
37	resolution to committee or shall be placed place it at the end of that day's calendar the calendar
38	for a Tuesday for consideration and decision without debate. The foregoing requirement of



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Tuesday consideration shall not apply to second reading of (i) resolutions specifically 1 2 contemplated by the North Carolina Constitution or statute or (ii) resolutions that pertain to the 3 internal functioning of either or both houses of the General Assembly. This subsection does not 4 apply to third reading of any joint resolution." 5 SECTION 4. Senate Rule 40(b), as contained in Senate Resolution 1, 2013 Regular 6 Session of the General Assembly, reads as rewritten: 7 "(b) All memorializing, celebration, commendation, and commemoration resolutions 8 shall be excluded from introduction and consideration in the Senate. Notwithstanding this, a 9 member may file a Senate memorializing, celebration, commendation, or commemoration 10 simple resolution after presenting the draft to the Chairman of the Committee on Rules and 11 Operations of the Senate and receiving the approval of that Chairman, except that the Chairman may refer the request to the full committee for approval. The approval of the Chairman or 12 13 committee shall be indicated on the Senate e-jacket. Senators should utilize a "Senatorial 14 Statement of Personal Privilege", as provided in Rule 15, as the preferred alternative to Senate simple resolutions that memorialize, celebrate, commend, and commemorate, other than for 15 16 those relating to deceased former members of the General Assembly." 17 SECTION 5. Senate Rule 32, as contained in Senate Resolution 1, 2013 Regular 18 Session of the General Assembly, reads as rewritten: 19 "RULE 32. List of standing/select committees. – The standing committees shall be: 20 Agriculture/Environment/Natural Resources 21 Appropriations/Base Budget 22 Appropriations on Department of Transportation 23 Appropriations on Education/Higher Education 24 Appropriations on General Government and Information Technology 25 Appropriations on Health and Human Services 26 Appropriations on Justice and Public Safety 27 Appropriations on Natural and Economic Resources 28 Commerce 29 Committee of the Whole Senate 30 Education/Higher Education 31 Finance 32 Health Care 33 Insurance 34 Judiciary I 35 Judiciary II 36 State and Local Government 37 Pensions & Retirement and Aging 38 Program Evaluation 39 Redistricting Rules and Operations of the Senate 40 41 Transportation 42 Ways & Means" 43 **SECTION 6.** This resolution is effective upon adoption.
