SECTION 2. G.S. 20-171.16 reads as rewritten:

"§ 20-171.16. Passengers.

No operator of an all-terrain vehicle shall carry a passenger, except on those vehicles specifically designed by the manufacturer to carry passengers in addition to the operator. A passenger on an all-terrain vehicle under the age of 16 shall wear eye protection and a safety helmet meeting United States Department of Transportation standards for motorcycle helmets."

SECTION 3. G.S. 153A-245 reads as rewritten:



"§ 153A-245. Regulation of golf carts <u>and all-terrain vehicles</u> on streets, roads, and highways.

- (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 20-50 and G.S. 20-54, a county may, by ordinance, regulate the operation of golf carts, as defined in G.S. 20-4.01(12a), and all-terrain vehicles, as defined in G.S. 20-4.01(1c), on any public street, road, or highway where the speed limit is 35 miles per hour or less within the county that is located in any unincorporated areas of the county or on any property owned or leased by the county.
- (b) By ordinance, a county may require the registration of golf <u>earts,carts</u> and <u>all-terrain</u> <u>vehicles</u>, charge a fee for the registration, specify who is authorized to operate golf <u>earts,carts</u> and <u>all-terrain</u> <u>vehicles</u>, and specify the required equipment, load limits, and the hours and methods of operation of golf <u>earts,carts</u> and <u>all-terrain</u> <u>vehicles</u>. No person less than 16 years of age may operate a golf cart <u>or all-terrain</u> <u>vehicle</u> on a public street, road, or highway."

SECTION 4. G.S. 160A-300.6 reads as rewritten:

"§ 160A-300.6. Regulation of golf carts <u>and all-terrain vehicles</u> on streets, roads, and highways.

- (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 20-50 and G.S. 20-54, a city may, by ordinance, regulate the operation of golf carts, as defined in G.S. 20-4.01(12a), and all-terrain vehicles, as defined in G.S. 20-4.01(1c), on any public street, road, or highway where the speed limit is 35 miles per hour or less within its municipal limits or on any property owned or leased by the city.

(b) By ordinance, a city may require the registration of golf <u>carts,carts</u> and <u>all-terrain</u> <u>vehicles</u>, charge a fee for the registration, specify who is authorized to operate golf <u>carts,carts</u> and <u>all-terrain</u> <u>vehicles</u>, and specify the required equipment, load limits, and the hours and methods of operation of golf <u>carts.carts</u> and <u>all-terrain</u> <u>vehicles</u>. No person less than 16 years of age may operate a golf cart or all-terrain vehicle on a public street, road, or highway."

SECTION 5. This act becomes effective December 1, 2013, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
