1 The Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on General Government is established. (a) 2 The Committee consists of 12 members as follows: 3 Six members of the Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the (1) 4 Senate. 5 (2) Six members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of 6 the House of Representatives. 7 Terms on the Committee are for two years and begin on the convening of the (b) 8 General Assembly in each odd-numbered year. Members may complete a term of service on 9 the Committee even if they do not seek reelection or are not reelected to the General Assembly, 10 but resignation or removal from service in the General Assembly constitutes resignation or 11 removal from service on the Committee. A member continues to serve until a successor is appointed. A vacancy shall be 12 13 filled within 30 days by the officer who made the original appointment. 14 "§ 120-296. Purpose and powers of Committee. The Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on General Government shall examine 15 16 on a continuing basis the services provided by the departments and agencies set out in this 17 subsection in order to make ongoing recommendations to the General Assembly on ways to improve the effectiveness, efficiency, and quality of State government services. - 1 (7) Monitor the quality of services provided by general government agencies to other agencies and the public.
 - (8) <u>Identify opportunities for general government agencies to coordinate and</u> collaborate to eliminate duplicative functions.
 - (9) Have presentations and reports on any other matters that the Committee considers necessary to fulfill its mandate.
 - (b) The Committee may make reports to the General Assembly. A report to the General Assembly may contain legislation needed to implement a recommendation of the Committee.

'§ 120-297. Organization of Committee.

- (a) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall each designate a cochair of the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on General Government. The Committee shall meet upon the joint call of the cochairs.
- (b) A quorum of the Committee is five members. No action may be taken except by a majority vote at a meeting at which a quorum is present. While in the discharge of its official duties, the Committee has the powers of a joint committee under G.S. 120-19 and G.S. 120-19.1 through G.S. 120-19.4.
- (c) Members of the Committee receive subsistence and travel expenses as provided in G.S. 120-3.1. The Committee may contract for consultants or hire employees in accordance with G.S. 120-32.02. The Legislative Services Commission, through the Legislative Services Officer, shall assign professional staff to assist the Committee in its work. Upon the direction of the Legislative Services Commission, the Supervisors of Clerks of the Senate and of the House of Representatives shall assign clerical staff to the Committee. The expenses for clerical employees shall be borne by the Committee.
- (d) The Committee cochairs may establish subcommittees for the purpose of examining issues relating to services provided by particular divisions within the State's general government departments.

"§ 120-298. Reports to Committee.

Whenever a department or agency set out in subdivision (a)(1) of G.S. 120-296 is required by law to report to the General Assembly or to any of its permanent committees or subcommittees on matters affecting the services the department or agency provides, the department or agency shall transmit a copy of the report to the cochairs of the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on General Government."

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
