(Public) Sponsors: Referred to: May 15, 2014 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO AMEND THE SELECTION CRITERIA FOR ADJUTANT GENERAL OF THE NORTH CAROLINA NATIONAL GUARD. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** G.S. 127A-19 reads as rewritten: "§ 127A-19. Adjutant General. The military head of the militia shall be the Adjutant General who shall hold the rank of major general, general, or attain the rank of major general pursuant to this section. The Adjutant General shall be appointed by the Governor in the Governor's capacity as commander in chief of the militia, in consultation with the Secretary of Public Safety, and shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor. No person shall be appointed as Adjutant General who has less than five years' commissioned service in an active status in any component of the Armed Forces of the United States. The Adjutant General, while holding this office, may shall be a member of the active North Carolina National Guard or naval militia. Guard. If an appointed Adjutant General does not attain the rank of major general with federal recognition within a reasonable period of time from the date of appointment, the Governor shall replace the Adjutant General with an appointee who meets the criteria in this section. A "reasonable period of time" shall take into account time in grade requirements for promotion or promotions and administrative periods necessary to complete the promotion process. In order to be eligible for appointment as Adjutant General, a person shall be a resident of the State of North Carolina and meet all of the following requirements: The person shall have a total of 10 years or more of commissioned service in (1) any component or components of the Armed Forces of the United States, with the total including a total of five years or more of commissioned service in any of the following branches of the reserve component of the Armed Forces of the United States: Army National Guard, Army Reserve, Air National Guard, and Air Force Reserve. The person, at the time of appointment, shall be one of the following: (2) A major general with federal recognition or who is eligible for federal recognition. A brigadier general with federal recognition or who is eligible for <u>b.</u> federal recognition and who is eligible for promotion to major general with federal recognition.
