moves to amend the bill on page 7, lines 5 through 35, by rewriting those lines to read:

"AMEND ISOLATED WETLANDS REGULATION

SECTION 8.(a). Until the effective date of the revised permanent rule that the Environmental Management Commission is required to adopt pursuant to Section 8(c) of this act, the Commission and the Department of Environment and Natural Resources shall implement 15A NCAC 02H .1305 (Review of Applications) as provided in Section 8(b) of this act.

SECTION 8.(b). Notwithstanding 15A NCAC 02H .1305 (Review of Applications), all of the following shall apply to the implementation of 15A NCAC 02H .1305:

- (1) The amount of impacts of isolated wetlands under 15A NCAC 02H .1305(d)(2) shall be less than or equal to one acre of isolated wetlands east of I-95 for the entire project and less than or equal to 1/3 acre of isolated wetlands west of I-95 for the entire project.
- (2) The mitigation ratio for impacts of greater than 1 acre for the entire project under 15A NCAC 02H .1305(g)(6) shall be 1:1 and may be located on the same parcel.
- (3) For purposes of Section 8.(b) of this act, "isolated wetlands" means a Basin Wetland or Bog as described in the North Carolina Wetland Assessment User Manual prepared by the North Carolina Wetland Functional Assessment Team, version 4.1 October, 2010, that are not jurisdictional wetlands under the federal Clean Water Act. An "isolated wetland" does not include an isolated man-made ditch or pond constructed for stormwater management purposes or any other man-made isolated pond.

SECTION 8.(c). The Environmental Management Commission shall adopt rules to amend 15A NCAC 02H .1300 through 15A NCAC 02H .1305 consistent with Section 8(b) of this act. Notwithstanding G.S. 150B-19(4), the rule adopted by the Commission pursuant to Section 8(c) of this act shall be substantively identical to the provisions of Section 8(b) of this act. Rules adopted pursuant to Section 8(c) of this act are not subject to Part 3 of Article 2A of Chapter 150B of the General Statutes. Rules adopted pursuant to Section 8(c) of this act shall
