A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT TO CREATE THE HIGH ACHIEVING TUITION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM  
FOR SCHOLARSHIPS FOR TOP-PERFORMING HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS  
ATTENDING NORTH CAROLINA COMMUNITY COLLEGES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** Purpose of Program. – There is created the High Achieving Tuition Scholarship Program. The purposes of the High Achieving Tuition Scholarship Program include the following:

- (1) Encourage higher-performing students at community colleges.
- (2) Utilize the State's educational resources to the fullest.
- (3) Create more educational and career options for students.
- (4) Realize significant cost-savings to the State.
- (5) Develop a more competitive workforce.

**SECTION 2.** Scholarship Eligibility. – A student shall be eligible to receive a High Achieving Tuition Scholarship if the student meets all of the following requirements:

- (1) In the academic semester prior to enrolling in a community college, graduates with at least a 3.5 unweighted grade point average from either a (i) public high school located in this State or (ii) a nonpublic high school or home school, as defined in Article 39 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes, located in this State.
- (2) Presents evidence of United States citizenship.
- (3) Qualifies as a resident of this State for tuition purposes, as provided in Article 14 of Chapter 116 of the General Statutes.
- (4) Gains admission as a degree-seeking student at a North Carolina community college.
- (5) Complies with Selective Service registration requirements.

**SECTION 3.** Award of Scholarships. – The State Education Assistance Authority (Authority) shall annually award High Achieving Tuition Scholarships to all eligible students in an amount not to exceed the cost of 16 credit hours of tuition per fall or spring academic semester for a maximum of four academic semesters. The Authority shall require students to complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to be eligible for a scholarship award and shall reduce the amount of the scholarship award for any student by the amount of grants or scholarships received by that student from other State or federal sources. The Authority shall award scholarships to eligible students in the order in which they are received. The Authority shall award scholarships beginning with the fall semester of the 2016-2017 school year to students graduating from high school in the 2015-2016 school year.



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1           **SECTION 4.** Scholarship Renewal. – A scholarship awarded to an eligible student  
2 shall be renewed if the student demonstrates maintenance of satisfactory academic progress by  
3 maintaining a 3.0 grade point average and completion of a minimum of 30 semester credit  
4 hours by the end of the academic year.

5           **SECTION 5.** Scholarship Revocation. – A scholarship awarded to an eligible  
6 student shall be revoked for any of the following at the conclusion of each semester:

- 7           (1) Failure to maintain a 2.5 grade point average.
- 8           (2) Failure to maintain a course load of at least 12 credit hours.
- 9           (3) Default or unpaid refund on a student financial aid program.
- 10          (4) Felony convictions for a controlled substances offense under Article 5 of  
11 Chapter 90 of the General Statutes.

12          **SECTION 6.** Scholarship Administration. – The Authority shall adopt rules for  
13 administration of the High Achieving Tuition Scholarship Program.

14          **SECTION 7.** Course Counseling and Transfer. – Community colleges shall ensure  
15 that scholarship recipients are provided counseling and assistance in selecting coursework that  
16 reflects their educational and career goals. For students planning to enter a constituent  
17 institution of The University of North Carolina, the State Board of Community Colleges shall  
18 ensure that credits earned by those students participating in the program are transferable.

19          **SECTION 8.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the State Education  
20 Assistance Authority the sum of two million dollars (\$2,000,000) for the 2016-2017 fiscal year  
21 for administrative costs and award of scholarships. It is the intent of the General Assembly to  
22 appropriate three million five hundred thousand dollars (\$3,500,000) in recurring funds for the  
23 2017-2018 fiscal year for administrative costs and award of scholarships. Any unexpended  
24 funds for this purpose shall not revert at the end of each fiscal year but shall remain available to  
25 award scholarships to eligible students.

26          **SECTION 9.** The Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina shall  
27 adopt a policy to permit any student admitted to a constituent institution who receives a High  
28 Achieving Tuition Scholarship to defer admission to the constituent institution for two years,  
29 beginning with the 2016-2017 school year.

30          **SECTION 10.(a)** For the 2015-2016 school year, the State Board of Education  
31 shall direct local boards of education to survey high school students in their senior year who  
32 meet the eligibility requirements of the High Achieving Tuition Scholarship to determine  
33 interest in the program, including numbers of students who intend to apply for the scholarship,  
34 and reasons that eligible students may choose not to apply for the scholarship. The State Board  
35 of Education shall report to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee no later than  
36 December 1, 2015, on the results of this survey.

37          **SECTION 10.(b)** The Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina  
38 and the State Board of Community Colleges shall jointly identify and report to the Joint  
39 Legislative Education Oversight Committee by April 1, 2016, on potential issues related to the  
40 transition of High Achieving Tuition Scholarship recipients from community college to  
41 university enrollment, and other recommendations to improve and expand the High Achieving  
42 Tuition Scholarship Program.

43          **SECTION 10.(c)** The State Education Assistance Authority shall report annually  
44 on or before September 1, beginning in 2017, to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight  
45 Committee on the implementation of the High Achieving Tuition Scholarship Program. The  
46 report shall include the following information:

- 47          (1) Number of students applying for the scholarship, including information  
48 about student demographics and geographic location.
- 49          (2) Number of students awarded the scholarship, including information about  
50 student demographics and geographic location, and community college  
51 attended.

- 1           (3)    Amount of funds expended for scholarships.
- 2           (4)    Number of students whose scholarships were revoked and reasons for
- 3                revocation.
- 4           (5)    Other relevant information, as determined by the State Education Assistance
- 5                Authority.
- 6           **SECTION 11.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2015.
