- (b) The information required to be posted under subsection (a) must be easily accessible and searchable.
- (c) The postings required by this section are in addition to any other posting requirements required by law or ordinance.
- (d) If an agency of North Carolina government or the political subdivision fails to comply with this section, the failure shall be considered a denial of access to public records and the procedures and remedies provided for in G.S. 132-9 shall apply."
- **SECTION 2.** G.S. 132-11(a), as enacted in Section 1 of this act, is rewritten to read:

## "§ 132-11. State and local government transparency.

(a) Every agency of North Carolina government and its subdivisions that have an Internet website must post on its website for the current calendar or fiscal <del>year year, and the four years immediately before that calendar or fiscal year, all of the following information:</del>

...."

**SECTION 3.** Section 1 of this act becomes effective December 1, 2015. Section 2 of this act becomes effective December 1, 2016. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
