18		consideration for the safety of the patients, and the right to refuse work that

21	<u>(3)</u>	The right to adequate and updated equipment and techniques to insure safer

23	<u>(4)</u>	The right to family-supporting wages so that mental health care workers can
24		devote their time to the care of their patients and not have to take on second
25		jobs.
26	<u>(5)</u>	The right to refuse excessive overtime.
27	<u>(6)</u>	The right to a timely briefing about the behaviors of patients that workers are
28		assigned to care for.
29	<u>(7)</u>	The right to be treated with respect and dignity regardless of job
30		classification.
31	<u>(8)</u>	The right to fair and equal treatment and opportunities regardless of race,
32		gender, age, national origin, immigration, sexual orientation, disabilities,
33		physical abilities, or religion."
