43 46	receive subsistence and travel allowances at the rates set forth in G.S. 120-3.1, 138-5, or 138-6,						
40 47	as appropriate. With the prior approval of the Legislative Services Task Force, the Legislative Services Officer shall assign professional and clerical staff to assist in the work of the						
47 48	Commission. With the prior approval of the Legislative Services Commission, the Commission						
40 49	may hold its meetings in the State Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building. The						
49 50	•	Commission may also meet at various locations around the State in order to promote greater					
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duties, may exercise all the powers provided under the provisions of G.S. 120-19 and

their possession, ascertainable from their records or otherwise available to them, and the power
to subpoena witnesses.
SECTION 5. Report. – The Commission shall make a final report of its findings
and recommendations to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee and the Joint
