A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT MEDICAL RECERTIFICATION IS NOT REQUIRED FOR 3 RENEWALS OF REMOVABLE WINDSHIELD HANDICAPPED PLACARDS IF THE 4 PERSON IS CERTIFIED AS TOTALLY AND PERMANENTLY DISABLED.
- 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 20-37.6(c1) reads as rewritten:

7 "(c1) Application and Renewal; Physician's Certification. - The initial application for a 8 distinguishing license plate, removable windshield placard, or temporary removable windshield 9 placard shall be accompanied by a certification of a licensed physician, ophthalmologist, or 10 optometrist or of the Division of Services for the Blind that the applicant is handicapped. The application for a temporary removable windshield placard shall contain additional certification 11 to include the period of time the certifying authority determines the applicant will have the 12 disability. Distinguishing license plates shall be renewed annually, but subsequent applications 13 14 shall not require a medical certification that the applicant is handicapped. Removable windshield placards shall be renewed every five years, and and, except for a person certified as 15 totally and permanently disabled at the time of the initial application or a prior renewal under 16 this subsection, the renewal shall require a medical recertification that the person is 17 18 handicapped. Temporary removable windshield placards shall expire no later than six months 19 after issuance."

20 SECTION 2. The Division of Motor Vehicles shall develop or update the appropriate forms and procedures necessary to implement this act. 21

22 SECTION 3. Section 2 of this act is effective when this act becomes law. The 23 remainder of this act becomes effective July 1, 2016.



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
