G.S. 18B-101 reads as rewritten: 7 "§ 18B-101. Definitions. 8 As used in this Chapter, unless the context requires otherwise: 9 10 "Premises" means all areas, whether inside or outside the licensed premises, (12a) 11 where the permittee has control of the property through a lease, deed, or 12 other legal process. (12b) "Powdered alcohol" means any powder or crystalline substance capable of 13 being converted into a liquid alcoholic beverage fit for human consumption. 14 "Sale" means any transfer, trade, exchange, or barter, in any manner or by 15 (13)any means, for consideration. 16 17 18 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 18B-102 is amended by adding a new subsection to read: 19 "(a1) Powdered Alcohol Prohibition. – It shall be unlawful for any person to manufacture, sell, transport, import, deliver, furnish, purchase, consume, or possess powdered alcohol." 20 SECTION 3. G.S. 18B-906(a) reads as rewritten: 21 Act Applies. - An ABC permit is a "license" within the meaning of G.S. 150B-2, 22 "(a) and, except for revocation pursuant to G.S. 18B-904(e)(3)G.S. 18B-904(e)(3), suspension 23 pursuant to G.S. 18B-904(e)(4), or for a confirmation pursuant to G.S. 18B-900(a)(8), a 24 25 Commission action on issuance, suspension, or revocation of an ABC permit, other than a 26 temporary permit issued under G.S. 18B-905, is a "contested case" subject to the provisions of Chapter 150B except as provided in this section." 27 **SECTION 4.** G.S. 150B-38(a) is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: 28 29 The Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission." "(7) **SECTION 5.** Sections 1 and 2 of this act are effective when this act becomes law. 30 Section 3 of this act becomes effective May 1, 2015, and applies to suspensions issued on or 31 32 after that date. Section 4 of this act becomes effective May 1, 2015, and applies to contested

33 cases brought on or after that date.



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
