Sponsors: Representative C. Graham. Referred to: A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE TUITION WAIVER FOR SURVIVORS OF LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS, FIREFIGHTERS, OR RESCUE SQUAD WORKERS AND CERTAIN OTHERS ALSO APPLIES TO CHILDREN WHOSE LEGAL GUARDIANS ARE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS, FIREFIGHTERS, OR RESCUE SOUAD WORKERS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** G.S. 115B-1(6) reads as rewritten: "§ 115B-1. Definitions. The following definitions apply in this Chapter: (6) Survivor. – Any person whose parent parent, legal guardian, or spouse: (i) was a law enforcement officer, a firefighter, a volunteer firefighter, or a rescue squad worker, (ii) was killed while in active service or training for active service or died as a result of a service-connected disability, and (iii) at the time of active service or training was a North Carolina resident. The term does not include the widow or widower of a law enforcement officer, firefighter, volunteer firefighter, or a rescue squad worker if the widow or widower has remarried." **SECTION 2.** G.S. 115B-2(a) reads as rewritten: The constituent institutions of The University of North Carolina and the community "(a) colleges as defined in G.S. 115D-2(2) shall permit the following persons to attend classes for credit or noncredit purposes without the required payment of tuition: Repealed by Session Laws 2009-451, s. 8.11(a), effective July 1, 2009. (1) (2) Any person who is the survivor of a law enforcement officer, firefighter, volunteer firefighter, or rescue squad worker killed as a direct result of a traumatic injury sustained in the line of duty. (3) The spouse of a law enforcement officer, firefighter, volunteer firefighter, or

General Assembly of North Carolina Session 2015 1 the child is not seeking a baccalaureate degree, the number of months 2 required to complete the educational program to which the child is applying. 3 Any child, if the child (i) is at least 17 years old but not yet 24 years old, (ii) (5) 4 is a ward of North Carolina or was a ward of the State at the time the child 5 reached the age of 18, (iii) is a resident of the State; and (iv) is eligible for 6 services under the Chaffee Education and Training Vouchers Program; but 7 the waiver shall only be to the extent that there is any tuition still payable 8 after receipt of other financial aid received by the student. 9 (6) Any child enrolled in a regional school established pursuant to Part 10 of 10 Article 16 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes who enrolls in classes at 11 a constituent institution or community college which has a written agreement 12 with the regional school." 13 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 115B-5(b) reads as rewritten: 14 "(b) The officials of the institutions charged with administration of this Chapter shall 15 require the following proof to insure that a person applying to the institution and who requests a 16 tuition waiver under G.S. 115B-2(2), (3), or (4) is eligible for the benefits provided by this 17 Chapter. 18 (1) The parent-child relationship shall be verified by a birth certificate, legal 19 adoption papers, or other documentary evidence deemed appropriate by the 20 institution. 21 The legal guardian-child relationship shall be verified by documentary (1a) 22 evidence deemed appropriate by the institution. 23 The marital relationship shall be verified by a marriage certificate or other (2) 24 documentary evidence deemed appropriate by the institution. 25 The cause of death of the law enforcement officer, firefighter, volunteer (3) 26 firefighter, or rescue squad worker shall be verified by certification from the 27 records of the Department of State Treasurer, the appropriate city or county 28 law enforcement agency that employed the deceased, the administrative 29 agency for the fire department or fire protection district recognized for 30 funding under the Department of State Auditor, or the administrative agency 31 having jurisdiction over any paid firefighters of all counties and cities. 32 The permanent and total disability shall be verified by documentation (4) 33 deemed necessary by the institution from the North Carolina Industrial 34

Commission."

SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to the 2015 fall academic semester and each subsequent semester.
