"§ 100-2.1. Protection of monuments, memorials, and works of art.

Approval Required. – Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of this section, a monument, memorial, or work of art owned by the State may not be removed, relocated, or altered in any way without the approval of the North Carolina Historical Commission.

- Limitations on Removal. This subsection applies only to a monument or memorial that meets the definition of an object of remembrance. The term "object of remembrance" means a monument, memorial, plaque, statue, marker, or display that is located on public property, that is of a permanent character, and that commemorates an event, a person, or military service that is part of North Carolina's history. An object of remembrance may only be relocated, whether temporarily or permanently, under the circumstances listed in this subsection and subject to the limitations in this subsection.
 - Permanent Removal or Relocation. An object of remembrance may be permanently removed or relocated only upon approval of the Commission and only after the Commission holds a public hearing, after not less than 10

The members of the Commission shall receive per diem and necessary travel and subsistence expenses in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 138-5.

A majority of the Commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

All clerical and other services required by the Commission shall be supplied by the Secretary of Cultural Resources.

SECTION 5.(b) The current members of the Commission shall complete the remainder of their terms. Upon expiration of the members' terms, new members shall be appointed in accordance with this section.

SECTION 6. Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes law.".
