2	expire, or when a vacancy occurs prior to the expiration of a term, members on the Advisory
3	Board shall be appointed in accordance with G.S. 115C-218, as amended by subsection (a) of

5	SECTION 2. The Department of Public Instruction shall transfer to the Office of
6	the State Board of Education nine hundred twenty-eight thousand twenty-eight dollars
7	(\$928,028) for the 2015-2016 fiscal year and nine hundred twenty-eight thousand twenty-eight
8	dollars (\$928,028) for the 2016-2017 fiscal year for the transfer and administration of duties
9	and responsibilities of the Office of Charter Schools.
10	<b>SECTION 3.</b> G.S. 115C-218.5(a)(3) reads as rewritten:
11	"(3) Granting the application would achieve one or more of the purposes set out
12	in <del>G.S. 115C-269.1.<u>G</u>.S. 115C-218.</del> "
13	SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law. The Chair of the State
14	Board of Education shall make the appointment to the North Carolina Charter Schools
15	Advisory Board of a nonvoting member as required by G.S. 115C-218(b)(2), as amended by
16	this act, within 45 days of the date this act becomes law. The North Carolina Charter Schools
17	Advisory Board shall elect a chair as required by G.S. 115C-218(b)(6), as amended by this act,
18	within 45 days of the date this act becomes law.
