6	SUSPENSIONS AND TO ALLOW STUDENTS TO MAKE UP THE WORK MISSED;
7	TO SPECIFY WHAT INFORMATION SHALL BE INCLUDED ON THE HEALTH
8	ASSESSMENT TRANSMITTAL FORM AND WHO IS AUTHORIZED TO HAVE
9	ACCESS TO THE FORM; AND TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND
10	HUMAN SERVICES AND THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION TO

If a health assessment transmittal form is not presented on or before the child's first 5 day, day of attendance, the principal shall present a notice of deficiency to the parent, guardian, 6 or responsible person. person standing in loco parentis. The parent, guardian, or responsible 7 person person standing in loco parentis shall have 30 calendar days from the first day of 8 attendance to present the required health assessment transmittal form for the child. Upon 9 termination of 30 calendar days, the principal shall not permit the child to attend the school 10 until the required health assessment transmittal form has been presented. A child shall not be 11 suspended for absences accrued for failure to present the required health assessment transmittal 12 form upon the termination of 30 calendar days, and the child shall be allowed to make up work 13 missed in accordance with G.S. 115C-390.2(1). It shall be noted in the child's official school 14 record when the health assessment transmittal form has been received. 15 (b) A health assessment shall include a medical history and physical examination with 16 screening for vision and hearing and, if appropriate, testing for anemia and tuberculosis. Vision 17 screening shall be conducted in accordance with G.S. 130A-440.1. The health assessment may 18 also include dental screening and developmental screening for cognition, language, and motor 19 function. The developmental screening of cognition and language abilities may be conducted in 20 accordance with G.S. 115C-83.5(a). 21 (c) The health assessment shall be conducted by a physician licensed to practice 22 medicine, a physician's assistant as defined in G.S. 90-18.1(a), a certified nurse practitioner, or 23 a public health nurse meeting the Department's Standards for Early Periodic Screening, 24 Diagnosis, and Treatment Screening. 25 This Article shall not apply to children entering kindergarten in private church (d) 26 schools, schools of religious charter, or qualified nonpublic schools, regulated by Article 39 of 27 Chapter 115C of the General Statutes. 28 As used in this section, "parent, guardian, or person standing in loco parentis" (e) 29 means parent, legal guardian, legal custodian, and caregiver adult, as those terms are used in 30 G.S. 115C-366." 31 SECTION 3. G.S. 130A-441 reads as rewritten: 32 "§ 130A-441. Reporting. 33 Health assessment results shall be submitted to the school principal by the medical (a) 34 provider on the statewide standardized health assessment transmittal forms form developed by 35 the Department and the Department of Public Instruction.Instruction and submitted to the 36 school principal by either (i) the parent, guardian, or person standing in loco parentis for the 37 student or (ii) the health care provider specified in G.S. 130A-440(c), if authorized in writing 38 by the parent, guardian, or person standing in loco parentis. The health assessment transmittal 39 form shall include only the items listed below: 40 A statement that the form and information on the form will be maintained on (1)file in the school once it has been completed. 41 42 The name of the school the student is attending or will attend. (2)A student information section to be completed by the parent, guardian, or 43 (3) person standing in loco parentis for the student that requires the following 44 45 about the student: first, middle, and last name; date of birth; sex; race; ethnicity; county of residence; and home address. 46 47 A parent information section that includes the following: name of the parent, (4) 48 guardian, or person standing in loco parentis for the student; a telephone 49 number; and space allowing the parent to share any concerns about the 50 student's health with those individuals authorized to have access to the form 51 in subsection (b) of this section.

4	SECTION 4.5. G.S. 115C-390.2 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:			
5	"(1) Board policies shall state that absences under G.S. 130A-440 shall not be			
6	suspensions. A student subject to an absence under G.S. 130A-440 shall be provided the			
7	following:			
8	(1) The opportunity to take textbooks home for the duration of the absence.			
9	(2) Upon request, the right to receive all missed assignments and, to the extent			
10	practicable, the materials distributed to students in connection with the			
11	assignment.			
12	(3) The opportunity to take any quarterly, semester, or grading period			
13	examinations missed during the absence period."			
14	SECTION 5. The Department of Health and Human Services and the Department			
15	of Public Instruction, pursuant to G.S. 130A-441, as amended by this act, shall develop a health			
16	assessment transmittal form for the 2016-2017 school year and shall report to the Joint			
17	Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services and to the Joint Legislative			
18	Education Oversight Committee on the revised health assessment transmittal form on or before			
19	December 1, 2015.			
20	<b>SECTION 6.</b> Sections 1 through 4.5 of this act are effective when this act becomes			
21	law and apply to children enrolling in the public schools for the first time beginning with the			
22	2016-2017 school year. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
