(b1) A pharmacist may dispense an opioid antagonist to a person described in subsection (b)subdivision (b)(1) of this section pursuant to a prescription issued in accordance with pursuant to subsection (b) of this section. For purposes of this section, the term "pharmacist" is as defined in G.S. 90-85.3.

- A person who receives an opioid antagonist that was prescribed pursuant to subsection (c) (b) of this section may administer an opioid antagonist to another person if (i) the person has a good faith belief that the other person is experiencing a drug-related overdose and (ii) the person exercises reasonable care in administering the drug to the other person. Evidence of the use of reasonable care in administering the drug shall include the receipt of basic instruction and information on how to administer the opioid antagonist.
- All of the following individuals are immune from any civil or criminal liability for actions authorized by this section:
 - Any practitioner who prescribes an opioid antagonist pursuant to subsection (b) (1) of this section.
 - Any pharmacist who dispenses an opioid antagonist pursuant to subsection (b1) (1a) of this section.
 - Any person who administers an opioid antagonist pursuant to subsection (c) of (2) this section.
 - The State Health Director acting pursuant to subsection (b) of this section." (3)
 - **SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
