1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO ELIMINATE THE NC FINAL EXAM AND THE ANALYSIS OF STUDENT 3 WORK PROCESS AS THE MEASURES USED TO EVALUATE TEACHER 4 PERFORMANCE AS PART OF THE EVALUATION INSTRUMENT AND TO MAKE 5 CONFORMING CHANGES. 6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 7 SECTION 1. The State Board of Education shall eliminate the use of the NC Final 8 Exam and the analysis of student work process and shall prohibit use of local final 9 examinations or an analysis of student work process to assess teacher performance and 10 professional growth as part of the North Carolina Teacher Evaluation System. 11 SECTION 2. The consolidated State plan to be submitted by the State Board of Education and the Department of Public Instruction to the U.S. Department of Education as 12 required by the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, 20 U.S.C. § 6301, et seq., as 13 14 amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act, P.L. 114-95, shall reflect the requirements of 15 Section 1 of this act. 16 SECTION 3. G.S. 115C-296(e) reads as rewritten: The State Board of Education shall develop a mentor program to provide ongoing 17 "(e) support for teachers entering the profession. In developing the mentor program, the State Board 18 19 shall conduct a comprehensive study of the needs of new teachers and how those needs can be 20 met through an orientation and mentor support program. For the purpose of helping local boards to support new teachers, the State Board shall develop and distribute guidelines which 21 22 address optimum teaching load, extracurricular duties, student assignment, and other working 23 condition considerations. These guidelines shall provide that initially licensed teachers not be

assigned extracurricular activities unless they request the assignments in writing and that other noninstructional duties of these teachers be minimized. The State Board shall develop and coordinate a mentor teacher training program. The State Board shall develop criteria for selecting excellent, experienced, and qualified teachers to be participants in the mentor teacher training program, including requiring that mentor teachers have been rated, through formal evaluations, at least at the "accomplished" level as part of the North Carolina Teacher Evaluation System and have met expectations for student growth.System."

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SECTION 4. G.S. 115C-296.11(b)(3) reads as rewritten:

- "(3) Educator preparation programs shall ensure clinical educators who supervise students in residencies or internships meet the following requirements:

- a. Be professionally licensed in the field of licensure sought by the student.
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- b. Have a minimum of three years of experience in a teaching role.
