"§ 14-269.2. Weapons on campus or other educational property.		
(a)		llowing definitions apply to this section:
		Educational property. – Any school building or bus, school campus,
		grounds, recreational area, athletic field, or other property owned, used, or
		operated by any board of education or school board of trustees, or directors
		for the administration of any school. The term shall not include any of the
		<u>following:</u>
		<u>a.</u> <u>Land, buildings, or other facilities owned, leased, or otherwise</u>
		controlled by educational institutions but not used primarily for
		educational purposes.
		<u>b.</u> <u>A religious institution for which facilities are used as a school on a </u>
		part-time basis, provided such facilities are not currently in use as a
		school.
		c. A road or other publicly used thoroughfare which crosses an
		educational campus.
		d. A medical facility for which the primary purpose is patient care
		rather than education."
SECTION 2. G.S. 14-269.2 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:		
"(b2) Restrictions on extracurricular activities listed in subsections (b) and (b1) of this		
section do not apply to persons not participating in the extracurricular activity, provided the		
extracurricular activity is conducted in a public place, including, but not limited to, a restaurant,
