2 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE AN EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY TO USE
3 UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS FOR EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT
4 RESPONSE PURPOSES.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 SECTION 1. G.S. 15A-300.1 reads as rewritten:

7 "§ 15A-300.1. Restrictions on use of unmanned aircraft systems.

8 ...

9 (c) Law Enforcement Exceptions. – Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (b) of
10 this section, the use of unmanned aircraft systems by law enforcement agencies of the State or a
11 political subdivision of the State is not prohibited in the following instances:

12 (1) To counter a high risk of a terrorist attack by a specific individual or
13 organization if the United States Secretary of Homeland Security or the
14 Secretary of the North Carolina Department of Public Safety determines that
15 credible intelligence indicates that such a risk exists.

16 (2) To conduct surveillance in an area that is within a law enforcement officer's
17 plain view when the officer is in a location the officer has a legal right to be.

18 (3) If the law enforcement agency first obtains a search warrant authorizing the
19 use of an unmanned aircraft system.

20 (4) If the law enforcement agency possesses reasonable suspicion that, under
21 particular circumstances, swift action is needed to prevent imminent danger
22 to life or serious damage to property, to forestall the imminent escape of a
23 suspect or the destruction of evidence, to conduct pursuit of an escapee or
24 suspect, or to facilitate the search for a missing person.

25 (5) To photograph gatherings to which the general public is invited on public or
26 private land.

27 (c1) Emergency Management Agency Exceptions. – Notwithstanding the provisions of
28 subsection (b) of this section, an emergency management agency as defined in
29 G.S. 166A-19.3(9) may use unmanned aircraft systems for incident command, area
30 reconnaissance, personnel and equipment deployment monitoring, and other related emergency
31 management response purposes.
