following findings:
(1) The defendant is a veteran as defined by Section 1 of this act.
(2) In the case that participation in the program is a condition of probation, the
requirements of G.S. 15A-1341(a) are satisfied.
(3) In the case that participation in the program is pursuant to a deferred
prosecution agreement, the requirements of G.S. 15A-1341(a1) are satisfied.
(4) In the case that participation in the program is pursuant to the terms of a

SECTION 2.(c) Under the Veterans Treatment Court program, the court shall 1 2 order that the defendant participate in one or more of the following services: 3 Mental health services. (1) Drug treatment services, including random testing for substance abuse. 4 (2) 5 Alcohol treatment services. (3) Other services designed to address the specialized problems faced by 6 (4) 7 veterans. 8 9

As a part of continued enrollment in the Veterans Treatment Court program, the defendant shall attend at least one court session per month. At each court session, the court shall inquire about the defendant's progress in the above-mentioned services as well as the defendant's overall participation in the Veterans Treatment Court program.

**SECTION 2.(d)** Sections 1 and 2 apply only to the following counties: Wayne, Lenoir, Green, Duplin, Sampson, Jones, and Onslow.

**SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective October 1, 2017.
