	ECTION 3. Beginning with the 2017-2018 fiscal year and subsequent fiscal	cal years
thereafter, for teachers who are paid on the "M" salary schedule under subdivision (4) of		
Section 2 of this act, determination of whether teachers and instructional support personnel		
shall be paid on the "M" salary schedule or receive a salary supplement for academic

preparation shall take place on an annual basis. Teachers and instructional support personnel may be moved off of the "M" salary schedule or discontinue receiving salary supplements if they are not meeting the requirements of subdivision (4) of Section 2 of this act in that year.

SECTION 4. Unless an individual otherwise qualifies under subdivision (2) or (3) of Section 2 of this act, teachers and instructional support personnel who earn an advanced degree in school administration shall not be paid on the "M" salary schedule or receive a salary supplement for academic preparation unless they serve as an assistant principal or principal.

SECTION 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 2017.
