Repeal Sales Tax on RMI.

Representatives Blust, Setzer, and Henson (Primary Sponsors). Sponsors: Referred to: A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO REPEAL THE SALES AND USE TAX ON REPAIRS, MAINTENANCE, AND INSTALLATION SERVICES. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** G.S. 105-164.3 reads as rewritten: "§ 105-164.3. Definitions. The following definitions apply in this Article: Real property contract. – A contract between a real property contractor and (33e)another person to do any one or more of the following: To perform construction, reconstruction, or remodeling with respect to a capital improvement to real property installation, repair, or any other service with respect to real property. To furnish tangible personal property to be installed or applied to real <u>b.</u> property and the labor to install or apply the tangible personal property that becomes part of real property. To provide the labor to install or apply the tangible personal property <u>c.</u> that becomes part of real property. (33i)Repair, maintenance, and installation services. The term includes the activities listed in this subdivision and applies to tangible personal property, motor vehicle, digital property, and real property except tangible personal property or digital property installed or applied by a real property contractor pursuant to a real property contract taxed in accordance with G.S. 105-164.4H: To keep or attempt to keep property or a motor vehicle in working order to avoid breakdown and prevent deterioration or repairs. Examples include to clean, wash, or polish property. To calibrate, refinish, restore, or attempt to calibrate, refinish, or b. restore property or a motor vehicle to proper working order or good condition. This activity may include replacing or putting together what is torn or broken. To troubleshoot, identify, or attempt to identify the source of a c. problem for the purpose of determining what is needed to restore property or a motor vehicle to proper working order or good condition.

Exemptions. – The tax imposed by this section does not apply to the sales price of or the gross receipts derived from a service contract applicable to any of the following items:

SECTION 5. G.S. 105-164.13(49) is reinstated.

SECTION 6. G.S. 105-164.13(61a), (61c), and (61d) are repealed.

SECTION 7. This act becomes effective July 1, 2017, and applies to sales made on or after that date.
