Short Title: Contraceptive Education for Women in Recovery. (Public) Sponsors: Representative Fisher. Referred to: A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES, DIVISION OF MENTAL HEALTH, DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES. TO DEVELOP AND MAKE AVAILABLE TO WOMEN RECEIVING TREATMENT OR SERVICES FOR ALCOHOL OR SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS ON LONG-ACTING. REVERSIBLE CONTRACEPTION. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** Article 3A of Chapter 122C of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read: "§ 122C-82. Contraceptive education for women in treatment for alcohol or substance use disorder. As used in this section, "long-acting, reversible contraceptive drug or device" or "LARC method" means a contraceptive drug or device that meets all of the following criteria: Is a method of birth control that provides effective contraception for an (1) extended period of time without depending upon user action. Is designed as a temporary method of birth control that the user can elect to <u>(2)</u> discontinue. **(3)** Has been approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration for use as a contraceptive. Is obtained under a prescription written by a health care provider authorized <u>(4)</u> to prescribe medications under the laws of this State. The Division, in consultation with the Division of Public Health, shall develop and make available, free of charge to the general public on its Internet Web site, in a format that can be downloaded, printable publications containing medically accurate information that is sufficient to allow a woman receiving treatment or services for alcohol or substance use disorder to make an informed decision about whether to use a LARC method while in recovery from alcohol or substance use disorder. The publications shall include at least all of the following information: An explanation of the LARC methods approved by the United States Food (1) and Drug Administration. An explanation of the medical processes involved in initiating and <u>(2)</u> discontinuing the LARC methods approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration. An explanation of the benefits associated with the use of LARC methods <u>(3)</u>



approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration.

SECTION 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 2017.
