1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO REQUIRE ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES AND MOTORCYCLES MEETING
3 CERTAIN CRITERIA TO BE REGISTERED WITH THE WILDLIFE RESOURCES
4 COMMISSION AND TO CHARGE A REGISTRATION FEE FOR ALL-TERRAIN
5 VEHICLES OR MOTORCYCLES REGISTERED FOR OFF-ROAD USE.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 **SECTION 1.** Article 21 of Chapter 113 of the General Statutes is amended by
8 adding a new section to read:

9 "**§ 113-278. Registration of certain off-road vehicles required.**

10 Except for vehicles exempted from registration under G.S. 20-51 or used primarily for
11 agricultural purposes or by law enforcement, fire, rescue, and emergency medical service
12 personnel in the performance of their duties, an all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle shall be
13 registered with the Wildlife Resources Commission in accordance with G.S. 113-278.1 if it
14 meets all of the following criteria:

15 (1) The all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle is not otherwise required to be
16 registered.

17 (2) The all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle was manufactured in the year 2005 or
18 later.

19 (3) The all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle is intended for off-road operation."

20 **SECTION 2.** Article 21 of Chapter 113 of the General Statutes is amended by
21 adding a new section to read:

22 "**§ 113-278.1. Registration of all-terrain vehicles and motorcycles for off-road use.**

23 (a) An all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle required to be registered pursuant to
24 G.S. 113-278 must be registered with the Wildlife Resources Commission in accordance with
25 this section.

26 (b) An owner registering an all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle for off-road use shall
27 supply the following at the time of registration:

28 (1) The Product Identification Number or Vehicle Identification Number.

29 (2) A manufacturer's certificate of origin or title, or an inspection and indemnity
30 bond if a manufacturer's certificate of origin or title is not available.

31 (c) The Wildlife Resources Commission shall issue an all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle
32 being registered under this section a registration plate or sticker that is different in color or
33 design from those issued by the Division of Motor Vehicles for similar vehicles so that law
34 enforcement officers can easily recognize the registration plate or sticker and the fact that the
35 vehicle upon which the plate or sticker is affixed must be operated off the roads, streets, and
36 highways of this State.



1 (d) All all-terrain vehicles or motorcycles registered for off-road use are subject to the
2 following title and registration fees:

3 (1) Registration fees. – The fee on an all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle registered
4 for off-road use shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00).

5 (2) Title fees. – The fee for a title on an all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle
6 registered for off-road use shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). The revenue
7 from the title fee shall be retained by the Wildlife Resources Commission to
8 operate the registration and titling system for off-road vehicles required to be
9 registered pursuant to G.S. 113-278.

10 (e) There is no requirement that an all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle registered for
11 off-road use has insurance on the vehicle or that the owner provides proof of financial
12 responsibility prior to the vehicle being registered.

13 (f) The Wildlife Resources Commission must collect sales and use tax, and any other
14 tax required to be collected pursuant to Chapter 105 of the General Statutes, on an all-terrain
15 vehicle or motorcycle being registered for off-road use and submit it to the Department of
16 Revenue. A credit will be allowed in accordance with G.S. 105-164.6(c) if the sales and use tax
17 was paid at the time of purchase and the owner provides acceptable proof of payment at the
18 time of registration."

19 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective January 1, 2018.
