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Restore Longitudinal Data System Board. (Public) Sponsors: Referred to: April 13, 2017 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO RESTORE AUTHORITY OF THE EDUCATIONAL LONGITUDINAL DATA SYSTEM TO A GOVERNANCE BOARD. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** G.S. 116E-1 reads as rewritten: "§ 116E-1. Definitions. "Center" means the Governmental Data Analytics Center as established in Part 8 of Article 15 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes."Board" means the governing board of the North Carolina Longitudinal Data System. "De-identified data" means a data set in which parent and student identity (2) information, including the unique student identifier and student social security number, has been removed. **SECTION 2.** G.S. 116E-3 is reenacted as it existed immediately before its repeal and reads as rewritten: "§ 116E-3. North Carolina Longitudinal Data System Board. There is established the North Carolina Longitudinal Data System Board which shall consist of the following 18-17 members: The Superintendent of Public Instruction, or the Superintendent's designee. (1) The President of The University of North Carolina, or the President's (2) designee. The President of the North Carolina Community College System, or the (3) President's designee. The Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services, or the (4) Secretary's designee of the Secretary affiliated with the Department's Division of Child Development. The State Treasurer, or the Treasurer's designee. (4a) The Assistant Secretary of the Department of Commerce, Division of (5) Employment Security, or the Assistant Secretary's designee. The Secretary of the Department of Revenue, or the Secretary's designee. (6) The Commissioner of Labor, or the Commissioner's designee. (7) The President of the North Carolina Independent Colleges and Universities, (8) Inc., or the President's designee. The Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, Department of Transportation, or the (9) Commissioner's designee.



(10)The State Chief Information Officer. Officer, or a designee of the Officer 1 2 affiliated with the Government Data Analytics Center. 3 The State Controller, or the Controller's designee. (11)4 (12)Three public Two advisory members from the membership of the Senate appointed by the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the 5 6 President Pro Tempore of the Senate. These advisory members shall not be 7 voting members of the Board. 8 Three public-Two advisory members from the membership of the House of (13)9 Representatives appointed by the General Assembly 10 recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives. These 11 advisory members shall not be voting members of the Board. One public member appointed by the Governor, to serve at the Governor's 12 (14)13 pleasure. 14 Appointed members of the Board shall serve terms of four years. Terms of 15 appointed members shall begin May 1, 2013, and every four years thereafter. Appointed 16 members may be reappointed but shall not serve more than two consecutive terms. Vacancies 17 among appointed members shall be filled by the appointing entity and shall be for the remainder of the vacant term. 18 19 The chair of the Board shall be the State Chief Information Officer. The Board shall (c) 20 elect from the appointed members members, other than those members of the General 21 Assembly, a chair and a vice-chair for a term of two years. 22 Members of the Board shall receive such per diem compensation and necessary 23 travel and subsistence expenses while engaged in the official discharge of the official duties as 24 is provided by law for members of State boards and commissions. 25 The Board shall hold One advisory member shall be jointly designated by the (e) Speaker of the House of Representatives and President Pro Tempore of the Senate to call an 26 27 initial meeting upon appointment of a majority of the appointed members. The chair of the 28 Board shall be elected at the initial meeting. The Board shall meet at least quarterly, but may 29 meet more frequently upon the call of the chair." 30 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 116E-4 reads as rewritten: 31 "§ 116E-4. Powers and duties of the Center-Board. The Center Board shall have the following powers and duties with respect to the 32 33 **System:**duties: 34 35 (4) Before the use of any individual data in the System, the Center-Board shall 36 do the following: 37 38 b. Develop and implement policies to comply with FERPA and any 39 other privacy measures, as required by law or the Center. Board. 40 41 (9) Establish an advisory committee on data quality to advise the Center-Board 42 on issues related to data auditing and tracking to ensure data validity. 43 (b) The Center-Board shall adopt rules according to Chapter 150B of the General Statutes as provided in G.S. 116E-6 to implement the provisions of this Article. 44 45 The Center-Board shall report quarterly to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight (c) Committee, the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations, and the Joint 46

(3) Any other recommendations made by the Center, Board, including the most effective and efficient configuration for the System."

The report shall include the following:

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Legislative Oversight Committee on Information Technology beginning September 30, 2013.

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1	SECTION 4. G.S. 116E-6 reads as rewritten:
2	"§ 116E-6. Data sharing.
3	(a) Local school administrative units, charter schools, community colleges, constituent
4	institutions of The University of North Carolina, and State agencies shall do all of the
5	following:
6	(1) Comply with the data requirements and implementation schedule for the

- (1) Comply with the data requirements and implementation schedule for the System as set forth by the Center.Board.
- (2) Transfer student data and workforce data to the System in accordance with the data security and safeguarding plan developed by the Center Board under G.S. 116E-5.
- (b) Private colleges and universities, the North Carolina Independent Colleges and Universities, Inc., and nonpublic schools may transfer student data and workforce data to the System in accordance with the data security and safeguarding plan developed by the Board under G.S. 116E-5."
- **SECTION 5.** G.S. 143B-1321(a)(31) and G.S. 143B-1322(c)(21) are reenacted as they existed immediately before their repeal.
- **SECTION 6.** The North Carolina Longitudinal Data System Board shall adopt rules pursuant to G.S. 116E-4 no later than December 1, 2017.
 - **SECTION 7.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
