2	AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COMMISSION TO STUDY THE
3	PROVISION OF WATER AND SEWER SERVICES BY PUBLIC ENTERPRISES.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	<b>SECTION 1.(a)</b> The General Assembly finds that the ability of a city or county to
6	efficiently and effectively provide public enterprise services, particularly water and sewer
7	services, is challenged by that local government opting to use revenues of the public enterprise
8	for purposes other than:
9	<ol> <li>Paying the costs of operating the public enterprise.</li> </ol>
10	(2) Making debt service payments.
11	(3) Investing in improvements to the infrastructure of that public enterprise.
12	(4) Reimbursing the unit of local government for actual direct services provided
13	to the public enterprise.
14	<b>SECTION 1.(b)</b> The General Assembly further finds that any excess net revenues
15	should be used to lower rates, advance fund debt service, and fund infrastructure improvements
16	of that public enterprise.
17	<b>SECTION 1.(c)</b> The Legislative Research Commission shall study the issues raised
18	in this section and make recommendations to the General Assembly on:
19	(1) Fee and charge setting by units of local government in the operation of a
20	water or sewer system, including collection rates of those fees and charges.
21	(2) Proper accounting controls to ensure transparency in budgeting and
22	accounting for expenditures and interfund transfers of public enterprise
23	services by units of local government.
24	(3) Legislation that may be necessary to ensure proper funding of infrastructure
25	maintenance and improvements for the provision of water and sewer
26	services, including whether regionalization could facilitate financially
27	healthy systems with lower fees and charges to customers.
28	(4) Legislation that may be necessary to ensure that units of local government
29 20	monitor aging water and sewer infrastructure to ensure proper maintenance
30	and repair, including how this responsibility impacts the financial health of
31	the public enterprise.
32	<b>SECTION 1.(d)</b> In making the study provided by this section, the Legislative
33 24	Research Commission shall consult with the Local Government Commission, the School of
34 25	Government, the Department of Environmental Quality, the North Carolina League of
35	Municipalities, the North Carolina County Commissioners Association, and others.



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## **General Assembly Of North Carolina**

1 SECTION 1.(e) The Legislative Research Commission shall make an interim 2 report to the 2017 Regular Session of the General Assembly prior to its reconvening in 2018 and shall make a final report to the 2019 Regular Session of the General Assembly. 3 4
