



## NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT Senate Bill 257

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#### Representative W. Richardson

moves to amend the bill on page 2, line 4, by increasing the amount for the 2017-2018 fiscal year by \$500,000 and by increasing the amount for the 2018-2019 fiscal year by \$20,000,000; and

on page 2, line 6, by decreasing the amount for the 2017-2018 fiscal year by \$500,000 and by decreasing the amount for the 2018-2019 fiscal year by \$20,000,000; and

on page 28, line 22, by rewriting the line to read:

"software as a service solution and anticipated costs for the continued implementation of the School Business System Modernization Plan for the 2018-2019 fiscal year. Thereafter, the State Superintendent shall submit annual reports"; and

on page 109, lines 16-17, by inserting between those lines the following new section to read:

### "FUND NC GROW/REDUCE DPI SCHOOL BUSINESS SYSTEM MODERNIZATION FUNDS

**SECTION 9.15.(a)** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the funds appropriated by this act for the 2017-2019 fiscal biennium to the Department of Public Instruction to implement the School Business System Modernization Plan, including an enterprise resource plan (ERP) system for integrated payroll and human resources information, an integrated State level licensure system, and reporting of financial information for increased transparency and analytics, shall be decreased (i) for the 2017-2018 fiscal year, by five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) in recurring funds and (ii) for the 2018-2019 fiscal year, by twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) in recurring funds.

**SECTION 9.15.(b)** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the funds appropriated by this act for the 2017-2019 fiscal biennium to the Community Colleges System Office shall be increased (i) for the 2017-2018 fiscal year, by five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) in recurring funds and (ii) for the 2018-2019 fiscal year by twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) in recurring funds to be used to administer the North Carolina Getting Ready for Opportunities in the Workforce (NC GROW) scholarship program established in subsections (c), (d), and (e) of this section.

# **FAILED**

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**SECTION 9.15.(c)** There is established the North Carolina Getting Ready for Opportunities in the Workforce (NC GROW) scholarship program (Program) to provide scholarships to enable recent high school graduates and certain members of the Armed Forces, including former members recently discharged from active duty, to enroll in a community college free of tuition and fees in accordance with this section. Subject to the limitations set forth in this section, the State Board of Community Colleges is authorized to (i) administer the Program consistent with the manner in which it administers funds to community college students qualifying for the Scholarships for Needy Students program under Article 35A of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes and the Need-Based Assistance program under G.S. 115D-40.1 and (ii) utilize criteria in the selection of community college students for the Program so that no qualifying North Carolina student incurs costs of tuition and selected fees to attend a community college beginning with the 2018-2019 academic year. The State Board of Community Colleges shall contract with the State Education Assistance Authority (Authority) to administer the Program. Funds appropriated for the Program shall be disbursed after funds are first awarded to students eligible for the Scholarships for Needy Students program, the Need-Based Assistance program, the High Achieving Tuition Scholarship Program, or any combination of these funds. Funds may then be appropriated under this Program to those students who do not demonstrate need or meet criteria sufficient to qualify for other financial assistance programs. The State Board of Community Colleges shall establish criteria for determining eligibility for the Program for community college students that includes at least the following:

- (1) The student is a legal resident of North Carolina for tuition purposes.
- (2) The student (i) graduated from a North Carolina high school, (ii) attained a high school equivalency certificate within 18 months of the first semester for which funds are disbursed, or (iii) enlisted in the Armed Forces within 12 months of graduation from high school and is released from active duty within 12 months of the first semester for which funds are disbursed.
- (3) The student has a minimum GPA of 2.0.
- (4) The student is enrolled at least half-time at a community college. Funds shall not be disbursed to a student until it is confirmed from the enrolling community college that the student meets the high school graduation and GPA standards for the scholarship.

**SECTION 9.15.(d)** A student may receive a scholarship under the Program for subsequent terms of enrollment provided that the student maintains satisfactory academic progress, as determined by the community college, and has not received the scholarship for more than six consecutive semesters. The State Board of Community Colleges may establish a minimum scholarship amount of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) per semester for full-time enrollment.

**SECTION 9.15.(e)** Consistent with the provisions for other financial assistance programs administered pursuant to G.S. 115D-40.1(c), beginning with the 2017-2018 fiscal year, funds appropriated for the Program shall not revert at the end of each fiscal year but shall remain available until expended for the operation of the Program. If the interest earnings on the funds appropriated for this Program are not sufficient to cover administrative costs for the

2	(1.5%) of funds appropriated for the Program each fiscal year to support the costs of			
3	administering the Program, including contracting with the Authority to administer the Program.			
4	Beginning with the 2017-2018 fiscal year, of the funds appropriated for the Program, the State			
5	Board of Community Colleges may use up to five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) to			
6	market NC GROW to prospective recipients and establish the Program. Beginning with the			
7	2018-2019 fiscal	2018-2019 fiscal year, any remaining funds shall be used to award scholarships to students in		
8	accordance with the requirements of the section.			
9	SECT	SECTION 9.15.(f) The State Board of Community Colleges and the State		
10	Education Assistance Authority shall report annually on or before September 1, beginning in			
11	2019, to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee on the implementation of the NC			
12	GROW Program. The report shall include at least the following information:
