4 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 7A-41 reads as rewritten:
5 **"§ 7A-41. Superior court divisions and districts; judges.**

6 (a) The counties of the State are organized into judicial divisions and superior court
7 districts, and each superior court district has the counties, and the number of regular resident
8 superior court judges set forth in the following table, and for districts of less than a whole county,
9 as set out in subsection (b) of this section:

45 (b1) The qualified voters of District 4 shall elect all judges established for District 4 in
 46 subsection (a) of this section, but only persons who reside in Onslow County may be candidates
 47 for one of the judgeships and only persons who reside in Duplin, Jones, or Sampson County may
 48 be candidates for the remaining judgeship.

50 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law, and elections in 2018 and
 51 thereafter shall be held accordingly.
