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6 7 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to elections held on or after that date. Notwithstanding G.S. 163A-1114, as enacted by this act, elections held in 2018 shall be conducted using the random selection process previously determined by the State Board of Elections and Ethics Enforcement for all primaries and elections in 2018. No further drawing shall be conducted for any ballot item for the 2018 election.

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
