Short Title: Hurricane Florence/Supplemental Act. (Public)

Sponsors: Senators Brown and B. Jackson (Primary Sponsors).

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL DISASTER RELIEF IN RESPONSE TO  
3 HURRICANE FLORENCE.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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6 **PART I. APPROPRIATIONS/AVAILABILITY/ALLOCATIONS OF FUNDS FOR**  
7 **HURRICANE FLORENCE DISASTER RELIEF**

8 **SECTION 1.1.** The appropriations and allocations made in this act are for maximum  
9 amounts necessary to implement this act. Savings shall be effected where the total amounts  
10 appropriated or allocated are not required to implement this act.

11 **SECTION 1.2.** There is appropriated from the Hurricane Florence Disaster Recovery  
12 Fund the sum of two hundred ninety-nine million eight hundred thousand dollars (\$299,800,000)  
13 for the 2018-2019 fiscal year.

14 **SECTION 1.3.** The funds appropriated in Section 1.2 of this act in the Hurricane  
15 Florence Disaster Recovery Fund created in S.L. 2018-134 shall be allocated as follows:

- 16 (1) Twenty-three million five hundred thousand dollars (\$23,500,000) to the  
17 Department of Public Instruction to be used to repair and renovate facilities of  
18 local school administrative units, laboratory schools, and innovative schools  
19 damaged by Hurricane Florence, and to repair or replace damaged furnishings  
20 and equipment of those facilities.
- 21 (2) One million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) to the Department of  
22 Public Instruction to be used to repair or replace food, food nutrition  
23 equipment, and food nutrition supplies damaged by Hurricane Florence in  
24 local school administrative units, laboratory schools, charter schools, and  
25 innovative schools participating in the National School Lunch Program or  
26 School Breakfast Program.
- 27 (3) Two hundred forty million dollars (\$240,000,000) to the Department of  
28 Agriculture and Consumer Services, Hurricane Florence Agricultural Disaster  
29 Program of 2018, established in Section 5.11 of S.L. 2018-136, as amended  
30 by Section 2.5 of this act.
- 31 (4) Five million dollars (\$5,000,000) to the Office of State Budget and  
32 Management for The Golden L.E.A.F. (Long-Term Economic Advancement  
33 Foundation), Inc., a nonprofit corporation, to provide grants to eligible entities  
34 capable of making loans to small businesses affected by Hurricane Florence.  
35 These funds shall not be subject to G.S. 143C-6-23(d).



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- 1 (5) Ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) to the Department of Environmental  
2 Quality, Division of Marine Fisheries to be used for commercial fishing  
3 assistance.
- 4 (6) Two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) to the Department of  
5 Environmental Quality, Division of Coastal Management to be used for the  
6 nonfederal match to funding provided through the Emergency Watershed  
7 Protection (EWP) Program administered by the Natural Resources  
8 Conservation Service of the United States Department of Agriculture for the  
9 removal of marine debris deposited along the shorelines of state-owned lands.  
10 If the Division of Coastal Management does not receive EWP funding, this  
11 allocation shall be used as provided in Section 5.12 of S.L. 2018-136.
- 12 (7) Fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to the Wildlife Resources Commission to  
13 conduct the study required in this act.
- 14 (8) Eighteen million five hundred thousand dollars (\$18,500,000) to the  
15 Department of Environmental Quality for the Coastal Storm Damage  
16 Mitigation Fund. Notwithstanding G.S. 143-215.73M(c), funds allocated by  
17 this subdivision may be used to provide no more than fifty percent (50%)  
18 of the nonfederal share for a federally funded eligible project, and no more than  
19 fifty percent (50%) of the total cost of an eligible project that is not federally  
20 funded. For purposes of this subdivision, an "eligible project" is a project that  
21 mitigates or remediates coastal storm damage to the ocean beaches and dune  
22 systems of the State.
- 23 (9) One million dollars (\$1,000,000) to the Judicial Department for the  
24 replacement of equipment and supplies, contractual services, and additional  
25 travel and personnel costs for additional court sessions required as a result of  
26 disaster-related courthouse closures.

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28 **SECTION 1.4.** The availability for Hurricane Florence disaster recovery activities  
29 in this act is set out below:
