1 moves to amend the bill on page 21, lines 43-44, by inserting between the lines the following:
2 **"AMEND IMPLEMENTATION OF VOTER ID CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT**

4 **SECTION 22.10.(a)** If Senate Bill 824, 2017 Regular Session, becomes law, G.S.
5 163A-1145.1(a)(1), as enacted by that act, reads as rewritten:

6 "(1) Any of the following that is valid and unexpired, or has been expired for one
7 year or less:

- 8 a. A North Carolina drivers license.
- 9 b. A special identification card for nonoperators issued under
10 G.S. 20-37.7 or other form of ~~non~~temporary-identification issued by
11 the Division of Motor Vehicles of the Department of Transportation.
- 12 c. A United States passport.
- 13 d. A North Carolina voter photo identification card of the registered voter
14 issued pursuant to G.S. 163A-869.1.
- 15 e. A tribal enrollment card issued by a State or federal recognized tribe.
- 16 g. A student identification card issued by a constituent institution of The
17 University of North Carolina, a community college, as defined in
18 G.S. 115D-2(2), or eligible private postsecondary institution as
19 defined in G.S. 116-280(3), provided that card is issued in accordance
20 with G.S. 163A-1145.2.
- 21 h. An employee identification card issued by a state or local government
22 entity, including a charter school, provided that card is issued in
23 accordance with G.S. 163A-1145.3.
- 24 i. A drivers license or special identification card for nonoperators issued
25 by another state, the District of Columbia, or a territory or
26 commonwealth of the United States, but only if the voter's voter
27 registration was within 90 days of the election."

28 **SECTION 22.10.(b)** If Senate Bill 824, 2017 Regular Session, becomes law, then
29 G.S. 20-7(f)(5) reads as rewritten:

30 "(5) License to be sent by mail. – The Division shall issue to the applicant a
31 temporary driving certificate valid for 60 days, unless the applicant is applying
32 for renewal by mail under subdivision (4) of this subsection. The temporary



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1 driving certificate shall be valid for driving purposes and shall not be valid for
2 identification purposes, except for voting identification pursuant to
3 G.S. 163A-1145.1, or when conducting business with the Division and not
4 otherwise prohibited by federal law. The Division shall produce the
5 applicant's drivers license at a central location and send it to the applicant by
6 first-class mail at the residence address provided by the applicant, unless the
7 applicant is ineligible for mail delivery by the United States Postal Service at
8 the applicant's residence. If the United States Postal Service documents that it
9 does not deliver to the residential address provided by the applicant, and the
10 Division has verified the applicant's residential address by other means, the
11 Division may mail the drivers license to the post office box provided by the
12 applicant. Applicants whose only mailing address prior to July 1, 2008, was a
13 post office box in this State may continue to receive their license at that post
14 office box, provided the applicant's residential address has been verified by
15 the Division.""
