4	SECT	TON 1. G.S. 143B-437.01 reads as rewritten:				
5	"§ 143B-437.01.	Industrial Development Fund Utility Account.				
6	(a) Creati	on and Purpose of Fund There is created in the Department of Commerce a				
7	special account t	to be known as the Industrial Development Fund Utility Account ("Utility				
8	Account") to provide funds to assist the local government units of the most economically					
9	distressed counties in the State in creating jobs. The Department of Commerce shall adopt rules					
10	providing for the administration of the program. Those rules shall include the following					
11	provisions, which	a shall apply to each grant from the account:				
12	(1)	The funds shall be used for construction of or improvements to new or existing				
13		water, sewer, gas, telecommunications, high-speed broadband, electrical				
14		utility distribution lines or equipment, or transportation infrastructure for				
15		existing or new or proposed buildings. To be eligible for funding, the water,				
16		gas, telecommunications, high-speed broadband, electrical utility lines or				
17		facilities, or transportation infrastructure shall be located on the site of the				
18		building or, if not located on the site, shall be directly related to the operation				
19		of the job creation activity. To be eligible for funding, the sewer infrastructure				
20		shall be located on the site of the building or, if not located on the site, shall				
21		be directly related to the operation of the job creation activity, even if the				
22		sewer infrastructure is located in a county other than the county in which the				
23		building is located.				
24	(1a)	The funds shall be used for projects located in economically distressed				
25		counties except that the Secretary of Commerce may use up to one hundred				
26		thousand dollars (\$100,000) to provide emergency economic development				
27		assistance in any county that is documented to be experiencing a major				
28		economic dislocation.				
29	(2)	The funds shall be used by the city and county governments for projects that				
30		are reasonably anticipated to result in the creation of new jobs. There shall be				
31		no maximum funding amount per new job to be created or per project.				
32	(3)	There shall be no local match requirement if the project is located in a county				
33		that has one of the 25 highest rankings under G.S. 143B-437.08.

35	(6)	The funds shall not be used for any retail, entertainment, or sports projects.
