SENATE BILL DRS45155-MKa-38

Short Title: NC Military Business Center Funds. (Public)

Sponsors: Senators D. Davis, Burgin, and Edwards (Primary Sponsors).

Referred to:

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE ADDITIONAL FUNDS TO SUPPORT THE OPERATIONS OF
3 THE NC MILITARY BUSINESS CENTER.

4 Whereas, the North Carolina Military Business Center (NCMBC) is a component of
5 the North Carolina Community College System operating as a statewide economic business
6 development organization that helps companies win federal defense contracts and focuses on job
7 growth in North Carolina; and

8 Whereas, NCMBC opened in 2005 to address the "opportunity gap" between North
9 Carolina's high military presence and low capture rate (1%) of defense contracts; and

10 Whereas, NCMBC has directly assisted businesses in winning over 3,093 contracts
11 representing a minimum value of \$10.3 billion, which has resulted in generating over \$476.5
12 million in State corporate income taxes and the employment of 345,975 people since NCMBC's
13 opening in 2005; and

14 Whereas, in 2018, federal agencies awarded \$6.1 billion in prime contracts to
15 companies in 95 of 100 North Carolina counties; and

16 Whereas, NCMBC's return on State investment equals 31:1; and

17 Whereas, NCMBC operates the following programs as part of its work activities:

- 18 (1) Business development, training, and assistance.
19 (2) Solicitation and proposal support.
20 (3) Strategic initiatives.
21 (4) Technology resources, such as MatchForce.org, which matches businesses to
22 federal opportunities and individuals to jobs in North Carolina.
23 (5) Employment support for the military workforce.
24 (6) Communication and outreach activities; and

25 Whereas, NCMBC intends to expand defense-related economic development
26 statewide and increase its services in underserved areas of the State, particularly in Western North
27 Carolina and in 10 to 15 counties, but requires additional State funds to do so; and

28 Whereas, the North Carolina Military Affairs Commission supports an increase in
29 State funding to NCMBC of an additional \$1 million each fiscal year; Now, therefore,
30 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

31 **SECTION 1.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Community
32 Colleges System Office the sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for the 2019-2020 fiscal year
33 and the sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for the 2020-2021 fiscal year in additional State
34 funds to support the operations of the North Carolina Military Business Center.



1 **SECTION 2.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, funds allocated to the
2 North Carolina Military Business Center shall not be reduced in order to meet any portion of a
3 management flexibility reduction.

4 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2019.
