HOUSE BILL DRH30351-MQ-66

Short Title: Limit Machines/Devices.

(Public)

Sponsors: Representative Terry.

Referred to:

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
2 AN ACT TO LIMIT ELECTRONIC MACHINES OR DEVICES NOT PROHIBITED BY LAW  
3 TO NO MORE THAN FOUR MACHINES OR DEVICES IN A SINGLE LOCATION.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 SECTION 1. Part 1 of Article 37 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended  
6 by adding a new section to read:

7 "§ 14-306.5. Limitations on electronic machines or devices.

8 (a) Definitions. – For the purposes of this section, the following definitions apply:

9 (1) Electronic machine or device. – As defined in G.S. 14-306.4, with the  
10 exception of the term "sweepstakes," which is as defined in this subsection.

11 (2) Sweepstakes. – Any game, advertising scheme or plan, or other promotion,  
12 which, with or without payment of any consideration, a person may enter to  
13 win or become eligible to receive any prize, the determination of which is  
14 based upon the use of skill or dexterity.

15 (b) A person may possess and place into operation up to four electronic machines or  
16 devices not prohibited by this Article within any building area as defined in Section 502.1 of the  
17 North Carolina State Building Code, provided all of the following conditions are met:

18 (1) The person otherwise complies with all of the provisions of this Article.

19 (2) The person complies with all applicable land use laws.

20 (3) The person has not been convicted of any violations of this Article or of any  
21 federal or State gaming laws.

22 (4) The electronic machines or devices are not located within 100 feet of any other  
23 electronic machines or devices possessed and operated under this section.

24 (c) Use of an electronic machine or device possessed and operated in compliance with  
25 this section shall not constitute a violation of this Part by a user.

26 (d) Any alcohol law enforcement agent and any other law enforcement officer shall have  
27 the authority and right to inspect any and all premises and electronic machines or devices for  
28 compliance with this section."

29 SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2019, and applies to offenses  
30 committed on or after that date.
