The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
SECTION 1. G.S. 143B-1363 reads as rewritten:		
"§ 143B-1363. <u>Information technology sourcing restrictions.</u>		
Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, State agencies and the constituent		
institutions o	f The University of North Carolina shall not purchase infor	rmation technology
hardware and	related components that have been manufactured in China	unless either of the
following conditions have been met:		
<u>(1</u>	No comparable product can be found that meets the requ	ired parameters for
	availability, performance, security, or functionality, incl	uding an operating
	system.	
<u>(2</u>)	The cost of a comparable product exceeds the cost of	the Chinese-made
	product by ten percent (10%) or more."

North Carolina shall adopt rules and procedures in accordance with this act no later than
