Teacher contracts.  agth of Contract. — A contract between the local board of education and a teache employed by the local board of education for less than three years shall be for a teacher who has been employed by the local board of education as a teacher for more shall be for a term of one, two, or four school years. A local board of require by policy that the three years of employment be consecutive.  Termination of Years of Employment. —  For purposes of determining whether a teacher has been employed for three years by a local board of education under this section, a year shall not be less than 120 workdays performed as a teacher in a full-time permanent position. If a local board of education requires by policy that the three years of employment be consecutive, the local board policy shall state that if the teacher in a full-time permanent position did not work for at least 120 workdays as a teacher in a year because the teacher was on approved or legally entitled leave, that year shall not be (i) deemed to constitute a year of employment for the teacher nor (ii) be considered a break in the continuity of consecutive years of employment for the teacher. A suspension shall not constitute approved or legally entitled leave for the purposes of this section Teachers may have additional rights to the extent required by the federa Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act, 34 U.S.C. § 4301, et seq.
