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**SECTION 1.(c)** If two members of the Board appointed by the General Assembly, upon the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, are serving on June 30, 2019, and the terms of both members extend past June 30, 2019, then the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall designate one member to continue to serve on the Board for the remainder of the member's term, and the term of the member not designated ends on June 30, 2019.

**SECTION 2.** G.S. 90-628 reads as rewritten:

"§ 90-628. Expenses and fees.
(a) All salaries, compen-

- (a) All salaries, compensation, and expenses incurred or allowed for the purposes of this Article shall be paid by the Board exclusively out of the fees received by the Board as authorized by this Article or from funds received from other sources. In no case shall any salary, expense, or other obligations of the Board be charged against the General Fund.
- (b) The Board may impose the following fees up to the amounts listed below for a license to practice massage and bodywork therapy:

**SECTION 3.** Section 2 of this act is effective July 1, 2019. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.

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
