3	COMPANIES; CREATE A CRIMINAL OFFENSE FOR IMPERSONATING A

8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
9	<b>SECTION 1.</b> This act shall be known as the "Passenger Protection Act" and may be			
10	cited by that name.			
11	SECTION 2.(a) G.S. 20-280.5 reads as rewritten:			
12	"§ 20-280.5. Safety requirements.			
13	(a) The transportation network company must require TNC drivers have their vehicles			
14	inspected annually to meet State safety requirements. The Division may, by regulation, specify			
15	alternative inspections that are acceptable as equivalent inspections, such as an inspection			
16 17	performed in another state. This subsection does not apply to brokering transportation network			
17 18	<ul><li>companies.</li><li>(b) The transportation network company's online-enabled application or platform must</li></ul>			
18 19	(b) The transportation network company's online-enabled application or platform must provide the following information to customers after a ride request is accepted by a TNC driver:			
20	(1) Photograph of the TNC driver.

24	(c) The transportation network company must maintain the following records:			
25	(1) The record of each TNC service provided in this State for one year from the			
26	date the TNC service occurred.			
27	(2) The record of each TNC <del>driver</del> <u>driver</u> , which includes a driver's name and			
28	<u>current address</u> , in this State for one year from the date the TNC driver			
29	terminated their relationship with the transportation network company.			
30	(d) The transportation network company must require a TNC driver to display the license			
31	plate number of the TNC driver's vehicle in a location that is visible from the front of the vehicle			
32	at the time a TNC service begins and at all times during a TNC service. The vehicle's license			
33	plate number displayed pursuant to this subsection must be printed in a legible font no smaller			
34	than the font of the license plate on the vehicle but is not required to be permanently mounted on			
35	the vehicle.

45	network companies and their operation within the State. The Commission shall consider issues

the Commission shall be six members. Any vacancy on the Commission shall be filled by the
appointing authority.

4 **SECTION 4.(e)** Members of the Commission shall receive per diem, subsistence, 5 and travel allowances in accordance with G.S. 120-3.1, 138-5, or 138-6, as appropriate. The 6 Commission may meet in the Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building. With 7 approval of the Legislative Services Commission, the Legislative Services Officer shall assign 8 professional staff to assist the Commission in its work. The House of Representatives' and the 9 Senate's Directors of Legislative Assistants shall assign clerical staff to the Commission. All 10 State departments, agencies, local governments, and their subdivisions shall furnish the 11 Commission with any information in their possession or available to them upon request.

12 **SECTION 4.(f)** The Commission shall make an interim report of its findings, 13 recommendations, and legislative recommendations to the 2020 Session of the 2019 General 14 Assembly and shall make a final report of its findings and recommendations to the 2021 General 15 Assembly. The Commission shall terminate upon the filing of its final report.

**SECTION 5.(a)** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2020-2021 fiscal year to develop and implement an awareness campaign to educate students at constituent institutions on what information a TNC must provide to help customers identify TNC drivers, pursuant to Article 10A of Chapter 20 of the General Statutes and additional identification requirements as enacted by Section 2 of this act.
