Senator B. Jackson

1 moves to amend the bill on page 1, by inserting the following between lines 32 and 33:

2 "SECTION 1.2.(c) Department of Environmental Quality Appropriation. – In
3 addition to any other funds appropriated during the 2019-2020 fiscal year, there is appropriated
4 from the General Fund to the Department of Environmental Quality the sum of seventeen million
5 six hundred thousand dollars (\$17,600,000) to match additional federal funds recently made
6 available for the Clean Water State Revolving Fund and the Drinking Water State Revolving
7 Fund.";

9 and on page 3, by inserting the following between lines 25 and 26:

11 "CLARIFY REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

12 SECTION 2.8.(a) Section 5.8 of S.L. 2018-136, as amended by Section 2.14 of S.L.
13 2018-138, reads as rewritten:

14 "SECTION 5.8.(a) Beginning January 1, 2019, the Office of Recovery and Resiliency
15 (Office) shall provide separate quarterly reports to the Director of the Budget, the standing
16 Appropriations Committees of the Senate and the House of Representatives, and the Fiscal
17 Research Division on the use of disaster recovery and assistance funds expended from the
18 Hurricane Florence Recovery Fund and from the State Emergency Response and Disaster Relief
19 Fund for ~~Hurricane Matthew~~. Hurricanes Matthew, Michael, or Dorian. The separate reports
20 shall summarize oversight activities and the results achieved as well as all of the following:

- 21 (1) Expenditures by program and by source of funds.
- 22 (2) Expenditures required to receive federal grants.
- 23 (3) Federal funding provided to the State to refund certain federally related
24 spending.
- 25 (4) Actual and projected State spending data including time lines and milestones.
- 26 (5) State spending data classified by disaster phase to include preparedness,
27 response, mitigation, and recovery.
- 28 (6) Total State spending data by agency and by program.
- 29 (7) Total State spending by program and county, where practicable.
- 30 (8) Location and job responsibilities of all time-limited State positions created
31 under this act or paid for with federal funds received as a result of Hurricane
32 Florence.

"SECTION 5.8.(c) Each report required by this section shall include information about all funds expended or encumbered pursuant to this act or any other act providing funds to address the impacts of Hurricanes ~~Matthew and Matthew~~, Matthew, Michael, Florence, or Dorian regardless of which State agency or non-State entity administers the funds. Non-State entities that administer or receive any funds appropriated in this act shall assist and fully cooperate with the Office of Recovery and Resiliency in meeting the Office's obligations under this section."

SECTION 2.8.(b) Effective May 16, 2019, Section 3 of S.L. 2019-15 reads as rewritten:

"SECTION 3. Transfer from the Office of State Budget and Management. – Of the funds allocated to the Department under Section 4.1 of S.L. 2018-136, the Office of State Budget and Management shall transfer the remaining sum to the Fund. The reporting requirements contained in S.L. 2018-136 and 2018-138 continue to apply to these funds and any other funds, whether State or federal, the Department receives or expends for the purpose of disaster recovery, relief, or resiliency."
