The Genera	Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
	SECTION 1.(a) It is the intent of the General Assembly to expand Medicaid
eligibility to	the following population of North Carolina veterans:
(1) Veterans with a modified adjusted gross income that is below one hundred
	percent (100%) of the federal poverty level.
(2) Veterans who are age 19 or older and under age 65.
(3) Veterans who are not entitled to or enrolled in Medicare benefits under Part A
	or Part B of Title XVIII of the federal Social Security Act.
(4) Veterans who are not otherwise eligible for Medicaid coverage under the
	North Carolina State Plan as it existed on January 1, 2020.
\$	SECTION 1.(b) For the purposes of this section, a veteran shall be defined as a
North Caro	lina resident who is entitled to any benefits or rights under the laws of the United
States by se	rving in and discharging honorably from the Armed Forces of the United States.

The sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2020-2021 fiscal year is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Health Benefits, for planning and preparation related to implementation of the Medicaid coverage described in this act.
