PART I. DEFINITIONS	
	ECTION 1. For purposes of this act, the following definitions shall apply:
(1)	Central office employees. – Superintendents, assistant superintendents, associate superintendents, directors/coordinators, supervisors, and finance officers employed in public schools.

(3)	
SI Public Instruc	and gloves, which meet the federal standards and guidelines from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, for all identified public school employees.
PART III. TEMPORARY SALARY SUPPLEMENT FOR IDENTIFIED PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES  SECTION 3.(a) From July 1, 2020, to December 31, 2020, all identified public school employees whose salaries are supported from the State's General Fund shall receive a	



salary supplement of five dollars (\$5.00) per hour.

 **SECTION 3.(b)** Notwithstanding G.S. 135-1(7a), the salary supplement awarded pursuant to this section is not compensation under Article 1 of Chapter 135 of the General Statutes, the Teachers' and State Employees' Retirement System.

**SECTION 3.(c)** This section expires December 31, 2020.

## PART IV. MISCELLANEOUS

**SECTION 4.(a)** The provisions of the State Budget Act, Chapter 143C of the General Statutes, are reenacted and shall remain in full force and effect and are incorporated in this act by reference.

 **SECTION 4.(b)** Except where expressly repealed or amended by this act, the provisions of any other legislation enacted during the 2019 Regular Session of the General Assembly expressly appropriating funds to an agency, a department, or an institution covered under this act shall remain in effect.

**SECTION 4.(c)** If House Bill 966, 2019 Regular Session, becomes law, and any provision of that act or a provision of the Committee Report described in Section 42.2 of that act conflicts with this act, this act shall control.

## PART V. EFFECTIVE DATE

**SECTION 5.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2020.

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
