Notwithstanding G.S. 143-341(4), and in addition to the powers granted in G.S. 116-198.34(5), the Board of Governors may authorize the constituent institutions and The University of North Carolina System Office to acquire or dispose of real property by lease if the

lease is for a term of not more than 10 years. The Board of Governors shall establish a policy for 1 2 acquiring and disposing of an interest in real property for the use of The University of North 3 Carolina and its constituent institutions by lease. This policy may delegate authorization of the 4 acquisition or disposition of real property by lease to the boards of trustees of the constituent 5 institutions or to the President of The University of North Carolina. The Board of Governors 6 shall submit all initial policies adopted pursuant to this section to the State Property Office for 7 review prior to adoption by the Board. Any subsequent changes to these policies adopted by the 8 Board of Governors shall be submitted to the State Property Office for review. Any comments 9 by the State Property Office shall be submitted to the President of The University of North 10 Carolina. After the acquisition or disposition of an interest in real property by lease, The University of North Carolina shall promptly file a report concerning the acquisition or disposition 11 12 to the Secretary of Administration. Acquisitions-With the exception of leases or interests for 13 communication purposes under G.S. 146-29.2(b1), acquisitions and dispositions of an interest in 14 real property by lease pursuant to this section shall not be subject to the provisions of Article 36 15 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes or to the provisions of Article 6 or 7 of Chapter 146 of the 16 General Statutes."

17 **SECTION 2.(a)** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of 18 Administration the sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) in recurring funds for 19 the 2020-2021 fiscal year to be used to retain, by contract, personnel to administer the 20 communication lease review process outlined in this act.

**SECTION 2.(b)** Of the funds appropriated to the Department in this section, an amount not exceeding the sum of ninety thousand dollars (\$90,000) may be used to retain the services of a real estate appraiser, licensed pursuant to Chapter 93E of the General Statutes, who holds a MAI designation from the Appraisal Institute, and an amount not exceeding one hundred sixty thousand dollars (\$160,000) may be used to retain the services of an attorney, licensed pursuant to Chapter 84 of the General Statutes, who holds a current certification in real property law.

28 SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2020, and expires on January 1, 29 2025.
