13	a person who plays at or bets on any lottery game being lawfully conducted in any state."

Registration, possession, and transportation of gaming equipment. 2 Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 14-295 or G.S. 14-297, it shall be lawful to (a) 3 possess or transport gaming tables and other gaming equipment, if the possession or 4 transportation is solely for use in game night events conducted pursuant to this Part. Gaming 5 tables and other gaming equipment possessed or transported pursuant to this Part shall not be 6 subject to seizure pursuant to G.S. 14-298 if they have been registered pursuant to the provisions 7 of this Article. 8 Any gaming table or other gaming equipment possessed or transported for use in a (b) 9 game night event must be registered with the Alcohol Law Enforcement Branch of the Department of Public Safety and must have a sticker affixed with a unique number. A fee of fifty 10 11 dollars (\$50.00) shall be charged for each sticker and each sticker shall be renewed annually. The sticker fees assessed under this section are payable to the Alcohol Law Enforcement Branch of 12 13 the Department of Public Safety and shall be collected and used by the Alcohol Law Enforcement 14 Branch to defray the costs of registering the gaming tables and gaming equipment. Possession or 15 transportation of a gaming table or gaming equipment that violates this subsection shall be a 16 Class 1 misdemeanor. 17 "§ 14-309.36. Permit procedure for game night vendors. 18 No person, firm, or corporation may receive compensation for providing gaming (a) 19 tables or gaming equipment for use in a game night without first obtaining a permit as provided 20 by this section. The application for a game night vendor permit shall be on a form prescribed by 21 the Alcohol Law Enforcement Branch of the Department of Public Safety and shall be submitted 22 to the central office. 23 (b) A fee of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) shall be charged annually for each permit. The 24 permit fees assessed under this section are payable to the Alcohol Law Enforcement Branch of 25 the Department of Public Safety and shall be collected and used by the Alcohol Law Enforcement 26 Branch to defray the costs of issuing game night vendor permits. The game night vendor permit shall be displayed at any event the game night vendor conducts. 27 28 (c) All gaming tables and gaming equipment owned or possessed by a game night vendor 29 must be registered pursuant to G.S. 14-309.35. 30 (d) At any game night event conducted by a game night vendor, the Alcohol Law Enforcement Branch of the Department of Public Safety shall inspect the gaming tables and 31 32 equipment at the location of the event prior to the event beginning. There shall be a fee of two 33 hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) for each inspection, payable to the Alcohol Law Enforcement 34 Branch of the Department of Public Safety, which shall be collected and used by the Alcohol 35 Law Enforcement Branch to defray the costs of conducting the inspections. 36 No person who has a felony conviction may be employed by a game night vendor." (e) 37 SECTION 3. G.S. 18B-1000 reads as rewritten: 38 "§ 18B-1000. Definitions concerning establishments. 39 The following requirements and definitions shall apply to this Chapter: 40 41 (5a) Qualified facility. – A facility that has any of the following permits: 42 On-premises malt beverage. a. 43 b. On-premises unfortified wine. 44 On-premises fortified wine. <u>c.</u> Mixed beverages. 45 d. 46 <del>(5a)</del>(5b) Residential private club. – A private club that is located in a privately 47 owned, primarily residential and recreational development. 48 . . . . " 49 SECTION 4. The Department of Public Safety shall make a report to the 2020 50 Regular Session of the General Assembly detailing the administration of game night event permits, including the total number of applications received by permittee type, the total number 51

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1 of permits issued, the number of ABC violations reported at establishments that hosted game

2 night events, and any other information the Department deems appropriate to report regarding

3 this act, and shall provide a recommendation as to whether the General Assembly should modify

4 this act. If the recommendation is to modify this act, the Department of Public Safety shall submit

5 recommended proposed legislation to the 2020 Regular Session of the General Assembly.

- 6 **SECTION 5.** This act becomes effective May 1, 2019. If a final order by a court of
- 7 competent jurisdiction finds that any portion of Sections 1 through 4 of this act is
- 8 unconstitutional, or if the passage of Sections 1 through 4 of this act would cause the State to
- 9 forfeit payments due under a compact entered into between the State and a federally recognized
- 10 Indian tribe, Sections 1 through 4 of this act are void.
