4	LOCAL DENTAL ANESTHETICS UNDER DIRECT SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED			
5	DENTIST, AND TO PERMIT CERTAIN DENTAL HYGIENISTS TO PRACTICE			
6	DENTAL HYGIENE AT SCHOOLS WITHOUT A LICENSED DENTIST BEING			
7	PHYSICALLY PRESENT.

10	"(b) A person shall be deemed to be practicing dentistry in this State who does, undertakes			
11	or attempts to do, or claims the ability to do any one or more of the following acts or things			
12	which, for the purposes of this Article, constitute the practice of dentistry:

14	(6) Administers an anesthetic of any kind in the treatment of dental or oral			
15	diseases or physical conditions, or in preparation for or incident to any			
16 17	operation within the oral cavity; provided, however, that this subsection shall			
17 18	not apply to a lawfully qualified nurse anesthetist who administers such			
18 19	anesthetic under the supervision and direction of a licensed dentist or physician; physician, or to a registered dental hygienist qualified to administer			
20	local anesthetics.
