1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO CHANGE THE ELECTION METHOD OF THE CALDWELL COUNTY
3	BOARD OF EDUCATION FROM NONPARTISAN TO PARTISAN.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. Section 4 of Chapter 1273 of the 1973 Session Laws reads as rewritten:
6	"Sec. 4. All-Beginning in 2022, all candidates for membership on the Caldwell County Board
7	of Education shall file for a nonpartisan election with the Caldwell County Board of Elections a
8	notice of such candidacy by noon on the last Monday in August prior to the General Election,
9	and this election shall be held at the time of said General election. be elected on a partisan basis
10	at the time of the general election in each even-numbered year as terms expire. Candidates for
11	election to the Caldwell County Board of Education shall be nominated at the same time and
12	manner as other county officers. Each candidate shall pay a filing fee of five dollars (\$5.00) and
13	in addition shall-certify in writing that he or she is a bona fide resident of Caldwell County and a
14	qualified registered voter therein. Persons elected shall assume office on the first Monday of
15	December following the General Election. The terms of their predecessors shall expire at that
16	same time. Members shall serve until a successor has been elected and qualified. The
17	requirements set forth in this section, together with such requirements as are now or may be
18	hereafter provided for by the North Carolina General Statutes, are inclusive and constitute the
19	sole criteria for membership on the Caldwell County Board of Education."
20	SECTION 2. Section 5 of Chapter 1273 of the 1973 Session Laws reads as rewritten:
21	"Sec. 5. All persons registered and qualified to vote in Caldwell County in accordance with
22	the General Election laws of North Carolina shall be eligible to vote in the nonpartisan partisan
23	election for the members of the Caldwell County Board of Education."
24	SECTION 3. Section 6 of Chapter 1273 of the 1973 Session Laws reads as rewritten:
25	"Sec. 6. In the event of a vacancy for positions elected on a nonpartisan basis in 2018 or 2020
26	on the Caldwell County Board of Education by reason of death, resignation, or a member's failing
27	to meet residency requirements as set forth above, or for other reasons, the remaining members
28	of the Caldwell County Board of Education shall appoint a person to serve until the next election
29	of members of such board, at which time the remaining unexpired term of the office in which the
30	vacancy occurs shall be filled by election. Beginning in 2022, vacancies for positions elected on
31	a partisan basis shall be filled by appointment by the remaining members of the Board in
32	accordance with G.S. 115C-37.1."
33	SECTION 4. This act does not affect the terms of office of any member elected in
34	2018 or 2020 to the Caldwell County Board of Education. The members of the Caldwell County
35	Board of Education elected in 2018 and 2020, or any member appointed to fill a vacancy for the



remainder of an unexpired term for a member elected in 2018 or 2020, shall serve until a
 successor has been elected and qualified.

3 SECTION 5. Effective on the first Monday in December of 2022, G.S. 115C-37.1(d)
 4 reads as rewritten:

5 "(d) This section shall apply only in the following counties: Alleghany, Beaufort,
6 Brunswick, <u>Caldwell</u>, Carteret, Cherokee, Clay, Cleveland, Dare, Davie, Graham, Guilford,
7 Harnett, Hyde, Iredell, Lee, Madison, New Hanover, Onslow, Pender, Rutherford, Stanly,
8 Stokes, Surry, Vance, Washington, and Yancey."

9 SECTION 6. Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes law
 10 and applies to elections conducted on or after that date.
