6	<b>SECTION 1.</b> Definitions. – As used in this act, "Council" means the Building Code					
7 8	Council, "Code" means the 2018 North Carolina Fire Prevention Code (NCFPC) as adopted by the Council, and "exit obstruction and waste accumulation provisions" means Sections 1031.2					
9	(Reliability), 1031.3 (Obstructions), 304.1 (Waste Accumulation Prohibited), 304.2 (Storage),					
10	and 304.4 (Valet Trash Collection Services) of the Code.					
11	<b>SECTION 2.</b> New Code Amendment. – Until the effective date of the Code					
12	amendment that the Council is required to adopt pursuant to Section 4 of this act, the Council					
13	and local governments enforcing the Code shall follow the provisions of Section 3 of this act					
14	with respect to exit obstruction and waste accumulation.

16	contrary, code enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over apartment occupancies shall permit
